

MAYBUGS, the Hailsham-based independent gift and homewares retailer, is to open a second much larger branch in Eastbourne this summer, breathing life into a large empty site in the centre of the town.

Opening at the end of July,
Maybugs will be taking over all
three floors of the former Laura
Ashley site on Terminus Road.

Greg Rose and John Dale, the coowners of *Maybugs* and driving force for local independent retail in Hailsham, are pressing ahead with their ambitious expansion plans despite the pandemic and lockdown setbacks over the past 12 months.

Secretly excited

Greg Rose said "John and I are just too excited, we've been working on this in secret for months. Covid delayed our expansion plans, but not even that was going to stop us. "We are ready and raring to bring beautiful things to the fabulous people of Eastbourne.

Maybugs magic

"We have so many wonderful customers that come from Eastbourne to shop with us in Hailsham, or order online via our website, that it was a natural move for us to open a second store here.

"The shop location is such a beautiful old building but has begun to look rather sad since it's been left vacant.

"We can't wait to get stuck in and help rejuvenate that end of the town with a bit of *Maybugs* magic.

There's a lot of work to do to get the store up to scratch over the next few weeks, and if all goes to plan, we hope to be flinging our doors open at the end of July ready for the summer season."

John Dale said "Of course we'll be stocking all the regular brands that our customers have come to know and love, however those of you who remember it as *Laura Ashley* will know how big it is!

Fabulous brands

"In fact, just the ground floor is more than double the size of our Hailsham branch, which as you can imagine has enabled us to source lots of new fabulous brands which will be available exclusively in the new Eastbourne store.

That special something

"And we are not giving all the secrets away just yet. We have something special planned for the 1st and 2nd floors which will be opening next spring."





Maybugs is owned by couple Greg Rose and John Dale. They opened their first branch in Hailsham's Vicarage Field in 2018. In 2020 they opened Flowers by Maybugs, a contemporary florist and floral design studio next door to their Hailsham gift shop.

Maybugs stock a huge variety of gift and homewares including brands such as Wrendale Designs, JellyCat and Inis. Prices start at just £1 and go up to £300 for some of their most luxurious items.

The new store opening will create eight jobs initially, which will increase to 20 when the 1st and 2nd floors open in 2022. Vacancies will be advertised on our *Maybugs* social media in the coming weeks.

The abseil is naturally socially distanced so if you're looking for an extra thrill while fundraising for your local children's hospice, *Chestnut Tree House* has you covered.



Future vision

EAST Sussex College reveals its eagerly anticipated, multi-million-pound vision for the future.

East Sussex College (ESC) has revealed its three-year plan in a virtual public consultation.

Through interactive displays and videos, visitors to the Virtual Town Hall can explore ESC's exciting vision and strategic intentions, giving feedback in the process.

Alongside its Eastbourne campus, East Sussex College has sites in Lewes, Newhaven, and Hastings.

Ambitious intentions

This new strategy outlines ESC's ambitious strategic intentions for the next phase of its journey and invites comments and feedback from the public.

Rebecca Conroy, CEO and Principal of ESC, said, "Our new strategy has allowed us to reflect and refresh on everything that we've done so far.

We merged in 2018 [Sussex Downs College and Sussex Coast College Hastings merged to become East Sussex College] and since then we've had Brexit and COVID, and seen a real change and shift in the needs of the community, so our plans reflect that."

Rebecca admits the proposed plans are ambitious, but equally, exciting. "It really does deliver," she continues. Most importantly, they're realistic too, as Rebecca points out, "it's to improve and extend on what we're already doing."



Proposed changes to the estate will make the biggest, immediate difference, particularly in Eastbourne.

Best experience

Plans include reallocating existing buildings, the Brickwork centre for one, to a centralised position on campus. A new building and covered courtyard space for socialising also features.

The first stages of development are due to start this month, with work being completed by 2024. Collegewide, ESC has already received £1.82m from the government this year to make initial developments possible, with further stages due for completion by 2023/24. In Eastbourne, an £8m grant to refurbish and relocate sites has been submitted to the government. This will give the college a modern update and provide the best 'in-'class' experience for its students.

Strengthen skills

The consultation also focuses on ESC's core offer. The college will strengthen its specialisms at each campus to ensure the curriculum offer better meets the needs of the local community, and equips students with the skills sought-after by employers, both locally and nationally. This will give students the upper hand when they finish their time at college. "We already work closely with employers to ensure what students are preparing for is absolutely what's needed in the workplace," Rebecca continues.

"There have been some shifts since COVID and Brexit, but we're encouraging students to keep training and to keep working with us as we come out of lockdown fully and see what the job market is looking like."

East Sussex College has already identified trends and needs here in Eastbourne, with clear specialisms reflecting this. "We will always offer a broad range of courses but we will develop the courses that feed into the local community's needs and the job market," Rebeca explains. "Here in Eastbourne, we will specialise in Health Sciences, Construction and the Business and Visitor Economy."

Local partnerships

Partnerships with local employers, such as the East Sussex NHS Trust, enables the college to give students the right progression routes. Work placements were halted due to lockdown — an integral part of the learning process for students — but at the end of May, students had the opportunity to engage in a week of virtual work experience activities, to help them understand what the world of work is looking like and manage their expectations.

East Sussex College launched its Public Consultation at an exciting time, when campuses reopened to all students and lockdown restrictions began to ease.

Development opportunities

Talking about the past year, Rebecca comments, "I cannot sing the praises of our students highly enough. We have seen such resilience from them. They have adapted to different types of delivery for their lessons some courses don't instantly lend themselves to being taught at home, brickwork or hair and beauty for example! Tutors have been creative in how they've connected to students throughout lockdown, ensuring they have everything they need at home. However, we are thrilled to now be back on campus, as we can ensure students have those vital and valuable skills to take them onto the next step."

Feedback to the Virtual Town Hall has been positive so far, with the community keen to find out about the college's plans. In Eastbourne, the college is fortunate to be space rich, providing ample opportunities for development.

The Public Consultation is open until the end of June. The public are invited to see the plans and feedback.

HOW OLD IS RADIO DGH?

Post from the President.

It predates the current hospital by many years as it all started in 1951 when some enthusiastic volunteers took a record player around the wards of St Mary's Hospital.

After a year or two, wiring was installed to broadcast through headphones and patient request programmes followed, continuing to this day.

Wiring was then put into the other hospitals until the new DGH was opened in 1976 when the current studios were opened, followed eventually by 'Phase 2'.

Switched on

The headphones were replaced by bedside systems offering free radio alongside paid TV systems. Then, in a major improvement, Radio DGH became an online station which allowed 'switched-on' listeners to listen via their computer or smartphone allowing patients' family and friends to listen and even make requests.

What progress over 70 years! What is next? Well hopefully patients will still be able to listen in and get requests.

Valuable aid

Many studies over the years have suggested that relaxed listening to radio, especially music, is a valuable aid to recovery. With the addition of online broadcasting, it could be thought that listening to Radio DGH outside of hospital could be a way of keeping well!

M quickly found that her experience of using social media whilst being housebound was just what they needed! She started with Instagram, and then offered to help at an event. (How amazing to see real people again!)

Volunteering has really helped M rebuild her confidence. She is happy to share that the team have supported her in everything she has done and will do the same for you!

1. Pre-heat the oven to 180°C. Line a 20cm square baking tin line with non-stick baking paper.

- 2. Mix the ground flaxseed, water and Dijon together in a small pot and leave a few minutes to thicken.
- 3. In a large bowl, add the oats, carrot, herbs, garlic powder, seeds, salt and pepper. Mix together.
- 4. Add the flaxseed mix and stir well to combine. After a minute or so the mix will start to stick together.
- 5. Press the mix into the tin and spread it out to all the corners.
- 6. Sprinkle the hemp seeds and nutritional yeast over the top and gently press into the surface.
- 7. Place in the oven and bake for 20 minutes until the top is lightly browned.
- 8. Remove from oven and leave to cool in the tin then cut into 8 slices. Once completely cool, transfer to an air-tight tin and keep in the fridge for up to 4 days.



CREAMY CELERY SOUP

O Prep time: 5 mins Oook time: 30 mins

Course: Soup

Servings: 6 portions

INGREDIENTS

- 1 medium onion, chopped.
- 1 medium potato, scrubbed and chopped.
- 2 heads celery, including
- 75 grams cashew nuts.
- 750 ml vegetable stock.
- 450 ml dairy free milk of choice
- Pinch celery salt.
- Salt and pepper to taste.
- Fresh chopped parsley, to serve (optional).

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Add a couple of tablespoons of water to a large saucepan and place it over a medium heat.
- 2. Add the onion, potato and celery. Pop on the lid and sweat for 5 minutes, stirring from time to time so the veggies don't stick. Add a little more water to the pan if they do.

- 3. Add the cashew nuts and the stock, scrapping up any browned bits from the base of the pan. Pour in half the dairy-free milk and add the celery salt.
- 4. Bring to the boil (be careful as it has a habit of suddenly boiling over if your back is turned!). Reduce the heat and simmer with the lid on for 20 minutes or until all the veggies are soft.
- 5. Turn off the heat and blend to smooth with a stick blender. Add more dairy-free milk as need to get the consistency you want (I like mine super thick!). Season with salt and pepper.
- 6. Serve with a garnish of fresh chopped parsley if desired.

Hormonal headaches?

HEADACHES can be caused by many factors; however, the constant fluctuation of hormone levels in women can trigger monthly hormonal headaches.

Over 70% of all migraines occur in women, and the majority of these are hormone related.

Hormonal headache symptoms

How do you know if your headache is hormonal? The most telling symptoms of a menstrual migraine is that it often begins on only one side of the head, lasts for several days, throbs and may induce nausea, fatigue, decreased urination, constipation, cravings and sensitivity to bright lights. About half of all women report symptoms either right before or during their cycle.

Imbalanced hormones

The main female hormone that naturally drops to its lowest levels during a cycle is oestrogen.

Both oestrogen and serotonin, a neurotransmitter that controls our pain and mood, constrict blood vessels, including the blood vessels in our head. While the exact reason for hormonal headaches still remains somewhat a mystery, *Hopkins Medicine* believes once oestrogen levels drop at the start of a cycle, it

can dilate the blood vessels in our head, creating a headache. Since men don't have fluctuating oestrogen levels, their headaches are likely more connected to changes in their serotonin levels, which can occur with an alter of pain or mood.

Oestrogen dominance

Oestrogen dominance may explain why some women experience hormonal headaches, while others don't notice any changes.

If a female is used to high levels of oestrogen throughout the rest of the month, a large, sudden drop of oestrogen can be the trigger for a migraine type of headache. This is similar to how removing caffeine can create headaches. The more the daily intake of caffeine, the greater the headache—oestrogen behaves the same way.

Oestrogen dominance is not only linked with hormonal headaches, it is often linked with increased risk of breast cancer. Signs of oestrogen dominance include tender breasts, acne, bloating, anxiety, hair loss, trouble staying asleep, fertility issues, night sweats and irregular cycles.

Fake oestrogen

Just how do women become oestrogen dominant in the first place? Most of the time, women are unknowingly exposing themselves to high amounts of fake oestrogen on a daily basis. This fake oestrogen, called xoenoestrogens, are foreign chemicals that are found in our environment and mimic real oestrogen in our body, but in reality they are stored and accumulate in our fat cells and can alter the function of our hormones.

Xenoestrogens exposure is strong enough to also affect male reproductive health as well. Xenoestrogens are found in plastics, herbicides, pesticides, soaps, makeup, clothing, nail polish, Tupperware, birth control pills, sunscreen, lotions and food preservatives.

The best thing we can do to limit our exposure to xenoestrogens is to limit our exposure to these items and choose more organic and chemical-free products. Treatments, such as acupuncture and cold laser therapy, can also be beneficial in balancing hormones, such as oestrogen and serotonin, for both men and women.

Hormone balancing nutrients

There are a few nutrients that are consistently found to be low in women who suffer from hormonal headaches. The first is magnesium, which is important for the prevention and treatment in a number of conditions relevant to women's health including insomnia, constipation and nerve sensitivity. In relationship to hormonal headaches, magnesium can reduce the amount of excess oestrogen in the body.

Another nutrient to help hormonal headaches is zinc. According to the Journal of Medical Hypotheses, zinc can help boost progesterone production. Zinc can help both female and males with fertility by increasing the amount of hormones used by the body for reproduction. Since oesterogen also increases the absorption of copper, which blocks zinc from being absorbed, it is extra important for a woman to have sufficient levels of zinc.

Additional supplements that have been found in studies to help control hormonal headaches CoQ_{10} , B_6 and ginger. In particular, a study from *Phytotherapy Research* found that taking 250mg of ginger powder daily decreased migraine symptoms about as well as Sumatriptan, a prescription drug for migraines. This may be because ginger can increase serotonin levels, which helps keep the blood vessels in the brain constricted and free from migraine triggers.

Oestrogen bacteria

Our gut flora also plays a big role in oestrogen balance. There is a collection of bacteria in our gut that makes specific enzymes that can push excess oestrogen meant for excretion back into our blood. Eating a diverse rainbow coloured diet filled with fruits and vegetables will help feed the correct type of bacteria in our gut to regulate oestrogen.

Exercise

Studies published from *Breast*Cancer Research show conclusively that exercise can lower levels of oestrogens. Only three hours of mild to moderate exercise a week is needed to significantly reduce excess oestrogen. Women with oestrogen dominant headaches will benefit from such exercise.

Relax

Any relaxing treatments, like guided imagery, breathing techniques, Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, massage, and biofeedback can help reduce hormonal headaches by lowering stress levels, which automatically helps regulate imbalanced hormones.

Cold showers

Cold therapy for headaches has been used in medicine for over one hundred and fifty years. The cold can constrict blood vessels and help reduce pain. Taking a cold shower or having an ice pack for twenty minutes on the painful area of the head has been found in studies to have the best effect.

Moderate sleep

Both too little and too much sleep can trigger a migraine. According to groundbreaking studies published from Missouri State University in 2011, a lack of sleep increases proteins in the brain that cause pain and even trigger migraines. However, over nine hours of sleep a night can imbalance serotonin levels that also induce headaches.

Stay hydrated

Being dehydrated is one of the biggest triggers for headaches. When the brain is dehydrated, it can shrink from fluid loss. This shrinking can

create the pain we feel as a headache, which is relieved with more intake of water. Hopkins Medicine recommends having about 1.5 to 2 litres of water each day for the most optimal amount of water to keep dehydration trigger headaches away.

Avoid headache triggers

Besides changing our lifestyle to help balance our hormones and ease headaches, it's equally important to also avoid known migraine triggers. These include aged cheese, alcohol, cured meats, sulphate containing food (like red wine and dried fruit), chocolate, additives (like MSG), excessive caffeine and stress.

Lastly, keeping a headache diary may help you determine further what triggers your hormonal headache for the future. Notice what day of your cycle headaches begin and how long it lasts. Also, note how much sleep you received the night before, the food you ate, the amount of exercise you had and any changing levels of stress.

Outdoor dance company to bring ballet magic to Eastbourne gardens

TOM'S MIDNIGHT GARDEN, Philippa Pearce's classic tale of the boy who wakes up to a world of adventure when a mysterious grandfather clock strikes 13, has been a favourite of readers since it was first published over half a century ago.

Now, for the first time, the story will be told through ballet, on tour through some of Sussex's most beautiful and celebrated garden spaces this summer.

Produced by Lewes-based dance company Frankly Speaking Productions, this new open air, COVID-secure production sets off on tour in late June, with the show running until early August. Destinations include the iconic Italian Gardens on Eastbourne seafront,

Sussex Archeological Society's Michelham Priory, and Wealden Literary Festival, among many others.

"Tom's Midnight Garden is an unforgettable story from so many of our childhoods," says producer Frances Livesey. "It's simply one of those stories we fall in love with again and again.

Rarely seen

But adaptations have rarely been seen in the old garden settings similar to those that inspired Philippa Pearce's novel. Moreover, the story, from its epic ascents to the ever-memorable scene where Tom and Hatty skate through the frozen Fens, almost seems made for ballet — and yet has never been told through dance before. So this feels like a really special project."

Critically acclaimed

The critically acclaimed piece of post-war literature tells the story of Tom Long, a young boy exiled to his aunt and uncle's apartment while his brother recovers from measles. 

Kittie Kipper – Inspiring kindness to our seas!

As part of Heritage Celebration week, The Tide Mills Village near Newhaven and Seaford will be hosting an exhibition celebrating a variety of artists and their work.

One of those artists is Kitty Kipper. An experienced fibre artist and a weaver, Kitty uses foraged plastic materials, primarily ghost nets, to create her pieces of work.

Ghostly dangers

So what are ghost nets and why are they a danger to our seas? Quite simply, ghost nets trap underwater sea life and more often than not, once trapped they will then die. As well as this, those larger animals who prey on the sealife can often then become trapped too.

These nets begin life as fishing nets but when lost overboard they are often irretrievable, so they float off to sea, therefore becoming "ghost nets". Artists like Kitty are making a huge contribution to saving our seas. Kitty herself has produced hundreds of weaving kits which have been distributed during lockdown to schools and homes in the local area.

Inspirational message

Kitty's plan is to use the nets to create one large piece of artwork by enlisting people to weave hundreds of woven circles together. When linked together she believes it will highlight the dangers of the nets and the importance of getting them out of the sea. Kitty is passing on her skills and sharing her message by producing craft kits and video tutorials!

An artist in the spotlight

STUART McCRORIE (1926 – 2017).

Stuart was born in 1926 and grew up in Dorset. After an abortive period as a medical student, he switched to art studying initially at the Beckenham School of Art under Carol Weight and subsequently at Bournemouth Art School.

Here he graduated with an Art Teachers Diploma and took up a post at Wimborne Grammar School, Dorset and later at a special needs school in Yorkshire. In 1957 he took up a position in Bexhill Grammar school where he taught for the next 35 years. Here he became a most popular teacher, admired and respected by students and colleagues alike.

Instantly recognizable

Throughout his long teaching career, he worked equally hard at his own work quickly developing a very strong and personal style that is instantly recognizable. This can be seen in equal measure in

his painting and sculpture which he also produced until he retired. Artists that bridge both disciplines in a convincing way are few and far between and Stuart was surely one of them. Although he did produce some oil paintings his chosen medium was gouache, an opaque water-based paint.

One man shows

Stuart regarded himself primarily as a teacher and shielded away from any form of overt self-promotion and never attempted to extend his reputation beyond Sussex where he exhibited throughout his career and well into his retirement. He had one man shows at *Michelham Priory* in the 1960's and in various galleries in Eastbourne and Brighton.

There is no doubt that, under different circumstances, Stuart's talent and output would have generated a far greater recognition, standing and significance but it is equally true that he would not have wanted to have lived any other way. Stuart died in 2017, aged 90.

Green and pleasant

JUNE brings us the longest day with extra hours of warmth and sunshine. In 2021, the solstice occurs on Sunday, June 20th, marking the start of summer in the Northern Hemisphere. The threat of frost has now long past and we can start planting in earnest. There's certainly plenty to keep you busy in the garden but also plenty to sit back and enjoy!

This month also marks, probably the busiest time of the year to visit open gardens. It is certainly the National Garden Scheme's busiest month. The easing of lockdown and hopefully the lifting of all restrictions later this month, mean we can all get out and enjoy those venues that open their garden gates for us all to share.

Geraniums: Garden favourites

Geraniums are popular summer plants in the UK. They add fragrant foliage and bright blooms wherever they're planted, whether that's in pots, planters or containers. They love bright sunny climates and moderate to regular watering, as long as they are planted in well-draining soil. They're relatively low-maintenance and are excellent choices for container gardening. Geraniums tend to thrive

when they're contained in pots as they keep the plants coralled and can also be easily moved to ensure they are receiving enough bright sunlight. Some geraniums grow best with a bit of afternoon shade as well. You can find them with blooms in vibrant orange, brilliant red, and eye-catching coral. The ivy geraniums bloom in white, red, coral, rose, and lavender hues too and you can get upright or trailing. All in all, a great choice for your garden this summer.

Driftwood this season

After remaining closed through 2020, due to COVID-19, I am opening my garden again for visitors over the next three months. Things will however be slightly different. On all three dates for the *National Garden Scheme*, 29th June, 13th July and 1st August, all visitors will have to pre-purchase their tickets and book a timeslot in order to visit. Unfortunately, no one will be able to arrive on the day without booking ahead. You can do this via

the home page of my website or by looking the garden up at:

www.ngs.org.uk. In addition to this, the garden will be open for private "by appointment" visits between 21st June and 12th August with all the entry and refreshment proceeds going to Macmillan Cancer Support. Full details are on the event page of my web site. The other two public days will be as part of the Macmillan Coastal Garden Trail which will take place on the 24th and 25th July when all visitors will be able to just turn up, more on that next month.

Garden tasks for June

As well as enjoying your plot this month there are a few jobs to be getting on with too. Something I'm not very good at, as I get impatient and want to plant summer annuals, is to wait until spring bulb foliage has died back naturally before cutting back! If you have sweet peas, start to pick as soon as they flower to encourage more growth. As new shoots appear on climbing plants such as honeysuckle and clematis, make sure you tie them up, to train them where you want them to grow! I have a few oriental poppies and they need to be cut back to the ground to stimulate new growth. Likewise, any hardy geraniums will benefit from a cut back after flowering to encourage more to follow. This month is the time to pinch out the tips of fuchsias too thereby creating a more-bushy plant and more blooms.

Tropical influence

If, like me, you want a little tropical influence in your garden, then why not invest in a thoroughly hardy plant like Aloe striatula. (See mine in header). It is an evergreen succulent with bushy, scrambling stems. It can be grown under cover or outdoors! The stems


and leaf sheaths are striped light and dark green. Yellow racemes of flowers with protruding orange stamens are produced on spikes 40cm high in summer. They always remind me of mini bananas, once they have turned yellow! I have two large specimens, both in the ground in the gravel garden at the back of the house, one either side of the central path up to the summer house. Indeed, one had got so big last year that I had to cut if back last Autumn and masses of small new growth has now emerged on the woody stems. They need no winter protection in my garden! They originate from South Africa and look pretty amazing planted with palms and grasses. Outdoors protect from excessive winter wet by ensuring very sharp drainage and plant in full sun.

National Garden Scheme

In addition to the many gardens that open on pre-planned days for the scheme each month, there are also many venues that open by arrangement only. These are listed on page 12 of the Sussex booklet or if you don't have access to one, via the web site, www.ngs.org.uk Just click 'find a garden' then select 'gardens open by arrangement' followed by 'discover by region'. There are 32 gardens in Sussex this month that will be happy to take your bookings and provide the appropriate catering for your visit.
