
Sleeping Beauty will be presented with all the colour and spectacle audiences have come to expect with surprises galore!


Sponsors are needed to make the annual *Tree of Light* the success it has become every year.

BEACHY Head Signals the Autumn with New Twilight Festival.

Beachy Head will signal the changing of the seasons with a new festival this October half term featuring stories of folklore, twilight nature walks and night time astronomy.

Celebrating the changing face of the iconic landmark at night,

'Afterlight' will mark the clocks going back with a series of free events from 23rd – 31st October organised by *Heritage Eastbourne*, as the darker nights draw in.

Funded by the European Regional Development Fund, via the Welcome Back Fund, the new nine-day festival will feature a range of events during both the daytime and evening in and around the vicinity of The Beachy Head Story exhibition.

From tales of Sussex folklore and twilight nature walks to creating craft naturescapes and stealing a glimpse of the Milky Way through



expert telescopes, 'Afterlight' will feature events for both adults and children, with some added spook factor on Halloween.

Nature walk

Events will include Sussex folklore storytelling for children, light and shadow craft workshops creating naturescapes and the chance to meet the owls from Sussex Falconry, while evening talks for adults reveal some of the stories from Eastern European legends to Viking warriors and Norse gods.

Wildlife lovers can join a twilight nature walk with Sussex Bat Group,

or for a stellar evening try a spot of star gazing with *Eastbourne Astronomical Society* and then pop into the pop-up planetarium courtesy of *The Observatory*.

Halloween will also see spooky Sussex folklore stories for children, with more festival events to be announced. Events are free but must be prebooked, with tickets available to book online at the end of the month.

Stephen Holt, Chief Executive of Your Eastbourne BID said "Over the



Community Led Homes making a real difference in Eastbourne

A TWO-YEAR-OLD community-led housing group is getting ready to develop land and build its first five affordable homes for people in housing need.

There are more than 500 similar groups across the UK, which are on track to deliver thousands of new homes and help alleviate the housing crisis.

More than just housing, this movement is all about communities making supportive, affordable, secure homes, together.

Eastbourne Community Land Trust (ECLT) is a registered Community Benefit Society, and currently, the 70 members are looking for new people to get involved.

"We are local volunteers with a passion to see community led homes make a significant difference in Eastbourne.

"Our affordable home ownership scheme will enable people on low incomes to own their own home and feel secure"

Anyone can become a CLT Member for just £1 and get involved or have a say in how the Society is run.

The first housing project is in Langney where they are acquiring a plot of land to build five new houses.

These are for key worker families in housing need so if you know of anyone who may be interested then please encourage them to go to www.eastbourneclt.co.uk

The Society raises funds through donations, and by raising finance through Community Shares, Grants, Mortgages, and Investment Loans.

The CLT model is a proven, independent, and sustainable way to create affordable housing, through community-led development.

CLTs are set up and run by local volunteers, and because homes are subject to an asset lock, community members become long-term stewards of the land it owns and the homes it builds.

This ensures genuine affordability based on what people actually earn in their area, not just for now but for every future occupier.

The Community Land Trust movement is a young and rapidly growing movement in England, as more and more communities take the future of their neighbourhood into their own hands.

Half the CLTs in the UK were formed in the last few years, and with every site development, CLT member organisations are encouraged to share good practice.

The Society's trustees in Eastbourne have benefitted during lockdown from networking with other CLTs to learn about the progress being made by other community led housing groups.

Chair & Chief Officer for *Eastbourne CLT*, Sandy Medway, said: "As a fairly new community-led housing group,



we have learnt much during lockdown from other groups, who are ahead of us with their developments.

"We are astounded by what they have achieved. As volunteers we've been particularly encouraged and helped by leaders of schemes in Sussex.

The government is channelling funds into community-led housing projects and *Eastbourne CLT* is now ready to benefit from this resource.

The guest speaker at the Society's AGM on 21st October is Tom Warder, leader of the Sussex Community-


led *Housing Hub*, who will give an overview of the unfolding landscape of emerging Sussex based CLTs.

Members of *Eastbourne CLT* will also be sharing their plans for the Langney site, and their passion for making a positive difference.







Chaseley are specialists in providing excellent care and treatment to people who have suffered a neurological disability or have a progressive condition and would benefit from long term therapy interventions, such as:

- Parkinson's Disease.
- Multiple Sclerosis.
- Motor Neurone Disease.
- Stroke.
- Head and Spinal Injury.



Referral criteria

If you are over 18, have a long-term neurological condition or complex physical disability, have identifiable and achievable goals, have needs that cannot be met by ESHT Outpatient or Community based service and you are registered to a GP Surgery within the Hastings and Rother, Eastbourne, Hailsham and Seaford or High Weald Lewes and Havens areas, then you may be eligible for treatment from our Therapy team's Outpatient service.

Should you wish to be referred to *Chaseley*, you need to ask your GP to complete a HSCC Form along with a report summarising your needs and including details of any other services that have been explored and why they are not appropriate.

Upon receipt of the referral, you will initially be assessed by a Physiotherapist who will discuss the treatment programme with you, based on your medical condition. They will identify your needs and goals, set therapy interventions, and target a treatment plan to conclude the treatment pathway, including any referrals to different agencies and services if appropriate. Your programme of treatment will be regularly monitored by the Physiotherapist to ensure the interventions are still applicable.



Picture pawfect finalists for Drusillas


DRUSILLAS Zoo Park has revealed the winners of its annual Animal Photographer of the Year Competition, sharing all the picture pawfect finalist entries.

Students return to Herstmonceux

STUDENTS have this month returned to the Bader International Study Centre based at Herstmonceux Castle after an 18-month gap without them during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Students returned to their home countries in March 2020 as the pandemic swept across the globe, cutting short their studies and time at the Castle which is owned and run by Queen's University located in Ontario, Canada.

Courses were rapidly converted to an online version and the Castle fell silent as not only students fled but the Castle was forced to close its doors to visitors as well.

Green list

The Castle reopened to the public in April of this year, but it's taken until this September for courses to restart in person with a raft of Covid safety measures being put in place to protect students, staff and the visiting public.

Most students have travelled to the Castle from Canada, a green list country, with a small number coming from other countries and having to undergo a ten-day quarantine period before they could join their classmates.

Safety measures in place include all students and staff wearing facemasks in Castle buildings and daily monitoring for COVID-19 symptoms.

100 local jobs

Dr J Hugh Horton, Vice Provost and Executive Director at the *Bader International Study Centre* said: "We are delighted to have students back and for near to normal life to have returned to the Castle. It's been a very strange 18 months during which

we successfully moved our provision online, but nothing can match the outstanding experience we are able to offer students in person. We have taken every step possible to ensure our reopening is done in a safe manner for not only our students but also for our staff and visitors to the Castle."

The Castle has operated at a campus of *Queen's University* since the mid 1990's and is home to approximately

150 fee paying students at any one time, supporting 100 local jobs, and attracting £5m a year from the University which ensures the Castle, an important heritage site and part of the East Sussex landscape, is able to stay open to the public.

Queen's University is one of Canada's oldest universities and a member of the U15 group of leading Canadian research universities.

It was also recently ranked 5th in the world in the *Times Higher Education Impact Rankings*, an assessment of over 1,100 universities for their work on sustainability.

Students, staff and local representatives were recently invited to congregate in a marquee at the Castle for the official Opening Ceremony at which every student and new member of staff is presented with an official scarf.

Students were not only welcomed by the academic staff at the Centre but also by Herstmonceux resident and Board member, Alan McInnes.







Eastbourne bubbles over for the latest arrival at The Beacon

THE latest opening in *The Beacon* has Eastbourne shoppers bubbling over with excitement.

Daily queues for *Pearls Bubble*Tea have been seen since it
opened in the shopping centre
this month and owner Peter Aaen
(pictured) admits the reaction
has exceeded all expectations.

The entrepreneur, who runs the family business that opened its first store in Brighton nine years ago, said: "We've been inundated since opening in *The Beacon*. The reaction has exceeded what we had hoped. As soon as school finishes, we have queues outside but it's not only students, we are seeing a wide variety of people wanting to try what's on offer."

Grab and go

Although bubble tea is now widely known, when Peter opened his first store in Brighton, the concept was relatively new to the UK, though not in the Far East where it is available on every street corner.

Bubble tea originated in Taiwan back in the 1980s and in its most basic form is made using mildly-brewed red tea mixed with condensed milk brewed over a layer black tapioca pearls. Today, there is a huge range of variations on the original theme and it is a drink with either a base of green or black tea infused with a variety of creamy extracts or natural fruit flavourings. It can be served either ice cold or piping hot.

Right location

Peter said: "I think it's so popular because it's a grab and go drink. It's thirst-quenching but you don't have to sit down and drink it. Bubble tea is refreshing with lots of flavours and it's a snack and drink all in one. Every single drink is made to order and can be customised so you can have it with all kinds of different toppings — we have over 40 flavours with different levels of sweetness."

Since opening in Brighton, Peter has opened nine other stores including Leeds, Sheffield and Leicester but this is only his second on the south coast.

He explained: "We'd been looking at Eastbourne for a while because we thought it was a really nice town centre but then Covid delayed things. When we think about opening a new store, we look for the right location that feels right for the business. *The Beacon* ticked all the boxes."

Before setting up *Pearls Bubble Tea*, Peter worked in a highly stressful London technology job, then decided to switch to working for himself and take a risk with a new venture.

Peter said: "It was a huge gamble. I left London for Brighton because I thought it was a place quirky enough for the idea to work. The concept really took off and we've never looked back."

The new Eastbourne store employs nine people and Peter hopes that



he can soon offer home delivery to local customers.

James Roberts, director of *The Beacon*, said: "It has been fantastic

to see queues in the centre for Pearls Bubble Tea. It is a great addition to The Beacon and our customers are making clear just how popular the concept is."



50 Year Anniversary and the future

THIS year, 2021, the Carr Taylor family is celebrating 50 years of growing and making wine in England.

As one of the oldest commercial vineyards in the UK it is one of the pioneering businesses that brought the potential of English wine to an unsuspecting consumer more familiar with continental fare.



The UK wine industry has changed considerably since then but the business continues to thrive due to its passion, adaptability and commercial approach. In that time it has survived a number of recessions, sceptical consumers, changing wine fashions, a huge increase in new vineyards and wineries, not to mention the vagaries of the British climate.

World leader

David and Linda Carr Taylor established their first vineyard in 1971; their son Alexander 'planting' the first vine at 18 months old. Today he now runs the day to day vineyard and winemaking operations with David and Linda still involved in promoting the brand.

They were one of the first producers of commercial sparkling wine in the country back in the 80's, establishing the direction of travel that the industry has taken over the intervening years to become a world leader in quality bottle fermented sparkling wine.

Multi award winning

Over the years they have won over 200 national and international awards including Gold medals in France in 1989 and 1999 for their sparkling wines right through to a Silver for


their white Bacchus still wine in this year's *Wine of Great Britain* competition. With a focus on UK sales and in particular local tourism in the south east the wines have also been exported throughout most of Europe over the years.

The vineyard is now focusing on the future, with expansion and tourism plans, looking for potential investment as the founders contemplate retirement and the business aims to secure its next 50 years plus of growing and serving quality English wine.

A PIONEERING digital medical practice, the first of its kind in the UK, has opened in *The Beacon*.

By **Peter Lindsey**

Digital First: The Beacon Practice is being opened by lead partners from Victoria Medical Centre (VMC), a merged practice of three GP surgeries in Eastbourne.

By opening in a shopping centre, offering around 70% of its services online plus additional lifestyle options including NHS prescriptions for Tai Chi and access to a chef through the *NHS*

Pioneering digital medical practice opens in The Beacon

to advise on healthy eating, the practice is the first of its kind to open in the UK.

In addition to consulting rooms, a large area at the front of the practice will be used for exhibitions and interactive events that will be open to visitors to the shopping centre.

Initially the surgery will open weekdays only from 8.30am until 6pm for patients of VMC, former patients of the Walk-In Centre at Eastbourne Railway Station that closed earlier this year, and university students, with the opportunity for anyone to use the services (if they are registered with the practice) being offered seven days a week next year.

As well as GP and nursing services, the new centre will offer access to a variety of other services including community cardiology, life coaches, mental health practitioners and nutritionists.

Different offer

Around 1,500 university students were expected to register during Freshers' Week giving them access to services they need such as meningitis jabs and even mental health support as they settle into life away from home for the first time.

The team behind the opening of the surgery has also run the vaccination centre in *The Beacon* that has given over 40,000 Covid jabs since opening in December 2020.

Lead GP for the practice, Dr Mark Gaffney, explained there were several factors which had led to the opening of the new premises in a shopping centre.

One of the three surgeries to form the amalgamated *Victoria Medical Centre* was town centre-based practice — The Bolton Road surgery.

Dr Gaffney said: "We always had a town centre practice so were looking

to open a new facility in the same area. Then when it was decided that the walk-in centre at the railway station was to close, that gave us another reason to work with the Sussex Clinical Commissioning Group to explore opening in The Beacon.

"We needed it to be a different offer in the town centre that would give greater access to a wider range of services. By opening the vaccination centre in The Beacon, it meant we could trial the experience of working in a shopping centre.

"This is a really exciting development for us and Eastbourne. Not only can patients see GPs by coming into the surgery but they can access all our services online.

"Anyone who needs support to access services online will be able to get advice and help from a team of on-site specialists so that our services are accessible to everyone."







Melissa Gordon Liquid Gestures

TOWNER Eastbourne is pleased to present a series of new works by Melissa Gordon. The presentation, Liquid Gestures, will be the largest institutional exhibition of work by the artist to date.

16 OCT 2021 - 30 JAN 2022

Formed of a series of new paintings and installation works, it invites us to reconsider the influence of women artists whose work has been eclipsed in art historical prose.

Melissa Gordon (b.1981, Cambridge, USA) is an artist, curator, and writer, whose practice is concerned with the body, gesture, and painting, through the lens of feminism. Liquid Gestures is a solo exhibition featuring large-scale paintings that further her examination of modern art histories, ideas of authorship, and the appropriation of certain 'gestures'.

In recent works, a grid, mesh, or chainlink fence, is the first image silkscreened directly onto the canvas, creating a framework that plays host to an array of intriguing references. Photographs and texts relating to her research are then painted or printed onto the surface, while outlines and silhouettes of painting tools, clothing, and domestic objects slip over and under colourful swathes of paint. Traversing between figuration and abstraction, these brushstrokes and pools of colour have been repainted and reproduced from the incidental mark-making on Gordon's studio wall with an almost forensic examination of gesture.

Gordon invites us to consider the significance and influence of artists such as Janet Sobel in relation to the drip painting and Dada poet Elsa von Freytag-Loringhoven in relation to the readymade. Their contributions to art history have been eclipsed in a culture of gender inequality that is noticeably persistent even today.

Margaret Mellis Modernist Constructs

TOWNER Eastbourne is pleased to present the first institutional exhibition in over a decade by British artist Margaret Mellis (1914–2009), one of the first and last survivors of the group of modernist artists that came together in St Ives, Cornwall, in the 1940s.

In 1939, aware of impending war, the artists Margaret Mellis and her husband Adrian Stokes relocated from London to St Ives in Cornwall.

Their move would become a significant catalyst in the formation of *The St Ives School*, which also included Ben Nicholson, Barbara Hepworth and Wilhelmina Barnes-Graham, who had followed them to St Ives. The school is heavily aligned with the story of British Modernism, with many of the artists becoming well-known. Margaret Mellis however remains largely overlooked.

This exhibition draws from Mellis' extensive repertoire of work, spanning her career and illuminating the breadth of her practice and underlying narratives: it brings together her early experiments in collage under the guidance of Ben Nicholson and Naum Gabo in the 1940s, the vibrant abstracts of

the 1950s and 1960s (reminiscent to those of her friend and contemporary William Gear), and the contemplative, yet playful driftwood constructions that dominated the final twenty years of her practice.

The strength of Mellis' work lies in her confident and relentless exploration of colour and form both on canvas and through her reappropriation of objects. Modernist Constructs introduces and reveals Mellis' artistic accomplishments, whilst aligning her within the British Modernist movement.

Exhibitions and Collections curator Karen Taylor, *Towner Eastbourne*, says, "The strength of Mellis' work lies in her confident and relentless exploration of colour and form both on canvas and through her reappropriation of objects. Modernist Constructs introduces and reveals Mellis' artistic accomplishments."



The society will be amongst the first performers to tread the boards of the newly reopened theatre, when its production takes residence there from 10th-13th November.



Green and pleasant

OCTOBER is definitely the time for clearing up - greenhouses, ponds, gutters and water butts may all need cleaning out. Wooden garden furniture will need covering or storing for the winter and terracotta pots may need bringing inside, so that they don't freeze and crack. If you don't already have a compost heap or bin, October is a great time to start one, with all the leaves and cuttings to be disposed of!

Sunday 31st October is Halloween and that is also the day the clocks go back, giving everyone an extra hour in bed to prepare for the event! If you have children, you may have a go at creating lanterns from pumpkins purchased at the supermarket or perhaps you've grown some yourself! They look great displayed in the garden or by the front door.

Chrysanthemums

A very common plant to have in the garden at this time of year is the ever-popular chrysanthemum or "pot mum". They are perfect to be placed in containers and bloom well into autumn and beyond. You can find

them for sale everywhere in a large variety of colours, in the header are some lemon ones in the garden at Driftwood. Care of container grown mums is relatively easy. You may want to repot it as soon as you get it home to give it room to grow. If you are careful and keep it well watered, you should be able to enjoy their blooms throughout the autumn months and possibly even the next spring.

Charity fundraising at Driftwood

This year, despite the weather and the impact of the pandemic, I have been able to hand over £12,868 to Macmillan Cancer Support, £8,281 from the garden trail I singlehandedly organise and £4,857 from events in my own garden, along with a further £1,864 to the National Garden Scheme. A grand total of £14,722 raised in 2021.

We've seen almost 700 visitors, some as a direct result of the whole page feature on the garden in the June issue of this magazine. The money has been raised through charging an entrance fee which includes a talk by me about the garden's creation, needless to say, many purchased my infamous tea and cakes when visiting which helped boost the fundraising. I have baked almost 600 portions of cake to sell in the garden with cappuccino cake being the firm favourite.

The main highlight this year has been, almost hitting, a running total of £100K fundraising for Macmillan since 2012. Whilst I'll claim full credit as the person creating the means by which the money can be raised, it is always a great team effort from all the many garden owners on the trail, the many supporters, visitors and volunteers. I have been blown away by several large donations made to me at Driftwood this summer too, totalling almost £1,000. Thank you all, we'll do it all again in 2022. The grand total of all monies now raised for all charities since 2009, has now topped £152,400.

Winter preparations
Traditionally, October is the month to lift tender summer bulbs such as gladioli and dahlias and store in a cool, dry place. I've carefully lifted mine and will store in the covered side alley. It is also the month to cut back perennials, but I've recently read a new school of thought says leaving the dead stems is good for wildlife and may also provide protection for the roots. Traditionalists will claim the stems harbour pests and diseases. Horticulturally, it makes little difference when they're cut back as long as it's done before new growth starts next spring.

New beginnings

This month sees a mini-digger arrive in my back garden! The last few weeks have been spent preparing the area to be radically changed. Plants have been dug up and safely retained in containers until the work has been completed. My garden slopes upwards away from the house and I'm having a large patio dug out, all held back by old railway sleepers. It is going to dramatically change the plot and my style of planting. In recent years, I've found the watering of my containers has become more of a chore than I would like and the older I get the harder it becomes. The new patio area will be home to succulents and drought hardy plants with many fewer containers and I'm confident will look very striking, watch this space!

If you only do one thing this month!

Do make sure you cover anything that might be damaged by frost. Most herbaceous perennials will be wintering underground and can be protected with a layer of bark compost. It is vital however to bring small succulents indoors or place them in a heated greenhouse. I'm certainly going to be kept busy as I have over 50 containers of aeoniums and other succulents to find winter homes for. Many will find their way into front and back porches of the house and the remainder will go in the greenhouse. You can protect larger plants, such as tree ferns and delicate palms, where they stand by tying horticultural fleece around their tops to keep them warm and cosy through the winter months.
