



Miles Hardy, 34, and Chris Phillips-Lowe, 33, set up *HPC Classics* on the White Knight Industrial Park, Hammonds Drive, Eastbourne 18 months ago, along with their business partner Francois Calvino.

They started with one small unit but have already expanded by taking over two further units on the same estate.

The future is looking very bright for *HPC Classics*, which specialises in high end prestige, classic and supercars.

It focuses on brands including Jaguar, TVR, Aston Martin, Alfa Romeo, Alpina, Fiat, BMW and many more.

Electric classics

They also build amazing vehicles from scratch, and soon will be offering classic electric vehicles as well, using the latest technology and will soon have their first mini available to buy.

Miles said: "It all started when Francois decided he wanted to buy a very special classic Lancia.

"He asked Chris, who was already working in the business of classic cars, for some advice. Chris immediately said to him that he'd need to speak with Miles, who knew the market, from one brief meeting a plan was formed... "Francois suggested we put together a business plan and before we knew it, we had an empty unit on the industrial estate.

"We made it very professional and clean in very quick time and customers were blown away with it. Word quickly spread."

Rapid expansion

Six months later, needing more space and the trio bought out *JAGtechnic* as a going concern, it had two units opposite. They chose to keep all of the staff and equipment, using Jaguar's dealer level software & tooling. They also use only genuine Jaguar parts.

Miles said: "We have invested heavily in what has become three units. We've bought more equipment and we feel we treat our staff very well, and they have all responded positively.



40 years of domestic bliss

FOR the last 40 years, this Eastbourne based, family run business has been in the community for four decades. It employs over 40 local people and has supported hundreds, if not thousands, of local families and individuals over the years; it's stuck around for a reason.

It all began at 409 Seaside Road in 1981, a shop which was originally Joan Blackhurst Hairdressing.

Originally the shop was run by father and son, Derek Baxter (who had started the company in Luton ten years before making the decision to move to the coast) and Andrew, who was 16. They were joined shortly after by Andrew's older brother David, and over time the third of the three brothers, Robert when he was old

enough (he was still at school at the time at of originally opening). Other shops have been trialled in the town over the years, but the original site has proven to be home. It is still the DB shop site today, and now spans numbers 407 to 423!



Two of the employees who joined at the same time are still here, Richard Murrell started in 1983 Darren Mace 1986. Among the 40+ employees who work at *DB Domestics*, there are now three generations of the Baxter family, including Andrew, David and Robert's partners, and several of Derek's grandchildren.

DB Domestics are pround to be involved in the community sponsoring local sports clubs and charities including Eastbourne Borough, Eastbourne Town and Eastbourne United.



To kick off the month-long celebration of the 40th Anniversary, the showroom was decorated with blue, yellow and gold balloons installed by a local party company, and DB cakes were created by a local baker to be given to customers. All staff gathered for a fun filled photo session in the sun and were joined in store over the weekend of the 1st and 2nd by




giving the opportunity to delve deeper in topics that directly affect them and their future. We're very excited to get involved and hear what the young people of Eastbourne have to say!"



BOOM: Battle Bar... an amazing success story in The Beacon shopping centre

It's a great new venture for Eastbourne and proving incredibly popular.

So, what exactly is on offer at the venue which is open for business seven days a week from 11am until midnight.

Please note it is over 18s only after 7pm.

You can either pre-book (which is probably the best option) or you can walk in and book your games at reception.



There are seven different activities:

- 1. Bayarian Axe throwing.
- 2. Nine-hole Crazier Golf.
- 3. Shuffleboard.
- 4. Beer pong.
- 5. Augmented reality darts.
- 6. Hammerschlagen.
- 7. American Pool.

Here's Assistant Manager Ashley Carnell: "The Bavarian Axe Throwing has attracted most media attention, and obviously you have to be 18 and over to play this.

"We have safety restrictions in place and you are not allowed to drink alcohol before or during this. It's especially popular with stag and hen nights.

"The Nine-hole Crazier Golf – and the Catapult crazy golf – is really popular, people love it. It's normally played in groups of four, and there is a maze and hill at the end.

"We have an extra bar — the Tikki Bar - open around the course with drink offers on Friday and Saturday evening.

"Shuttleboard is great fun using metal pucks. It's normally played in teams and the first one to 15 wins.

"Beer pong is loads of fun, using cups, water and beer, while the augmented reality darts is for up to 10 people at a time.

"There are four mini games - Killer, Disco Wall, Halve It and Robin Hood - ranging from easy to difficult. It takes about an hour.

"The Hammerschlagen involves getting six-to-eight-inch nails into the wood, and you need a real rhythm for this one.

"And American pool is what it says people love playing pool."

Boom: Battle Bar is also a great place to go before a late night at the venues open till the early hours.

There's also a great food and cocktails menu as well as a photo booth.

Christmas bookings are going really well.

Embrace East Sussex was cofounded in 2014 by Rebecca, a parent struggling emotionally after her son Harry was diagnosed with dyslexia, ADHD, anxiety, learning disability, and Autism with significant and disordered language skills.

She knew from a very young age that there was something different about Harry but finding the right support to get Harry his diagnosis was a mission that felt very overwhelming and never ending. Once Harry was given his diagnosis, Rebecca vowed that no other parent or child should ever feel as alone as she did in her mission to help her son and so, Embrace was born.

Since then *Embrace* have helped hundreds if not thousands of children and their parents/carers to access services that would enable them to reach their potential and have even set up specialist projects and services of their own to fill gaps in local provision where they have found them.

Then the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020 hit them and brought the charity to its knees. Embrace East Sussex rallied the troops and put together care and home schooling packages for their families but knew this would not be enough to support them. So, the Parent Support Group went online and onto the phone lines and they didn't stop getting calls for help and support from across East Sussex. The surprising thing to Embrace and the Parent Support Team though, was that they began to get calls from people

in-fact, who needed help and support because they just could not get the same support where they lived.

Emergency Government and National Lottery funding just about saw them through those dark times. However, Embrace always knew that the real test would be when the country went back to "normal". Now, Embrace East Sussex are faced with the reality that to continue to provide the services on offer to the hundreds of children who have special needs and disabilities and the families/carers that they support, Embrace need to raise approximately £35,000 by February 2022.

Embrace know that they can climb the mountain, but they cannot do this alone.



EASTBOURNE Borough Council has landed £19.8 million investment in the town after a bid to the government's levelling up fund unlocked the multi-million pound windfall.

The cash will underpin an ambitious and far-reaching plan to link town centre regeneration with a strengthened visitor economy — the project will see:

- £7.623 million...to convert Victoria Place into a vibrant, pedestrianised cultural district, including new green energy infrastructure, with awnings, lighting and heating; with excellent independent cafes and restaurants serving high quality, locally sourced food and drink all year round, also developing a night-time economy.
- £11.186 million...to create a worldclass culture and education centre at *Black Robin Farm*, a former dairy farm set on the Downs above the town, connecting the *South Downs National Park (SDNP)* with the town centre and seafront and providing a new destination for around 100,000 visitors per year, space for new businesses and work placements for young people during both the construction and operational phases.
- £1.037 million...investment in the Towner's Centenary project, creating a number of legacy public artworks across the town that will provide an arts trail connecting the seafront, town centre and SDNP, as well as enhancing gallery facilities to support the education and outreach programmes that will engage strongly with some of Eastbourne's most disadvantaged communities.

Councillor David Tutt, Leader of Eastbourne Borough Council, said: "This is a legacy defining moment in the history of our wonderful town and one that will benefit generations of residents, both now and long into the future.

"I'm obviously delighted that the government recognised the great ambition within our plans and now look forward to starting the project work and fulfilling the bid's huge potential.

"I must also thank all those who have contributed to this great council success. Special thanks to Christina Ewbank and all the other members of the *Stakeholder Group* for their constructive and supportive contributions and the council officers who drafted the bid.

"Eastbourne working together is Eastbourne at its best!"

The news of the bid success means that the Towner project will be completed in 2023 with Black Robin Farm and Victoria Place following shortly after in early 2024.

Christina Ewbank, Chair of the Eastbourne Stakeholder Group, said: "What a terrific and deserved boost for Eastbourne and all who live and work here.

"The bid is really exciting with so many transformative elements within it, be it new infrastructure, cultural and lifestyle developments, educational and employment opportunities and stronger links with the national park and throughout the town.

"Eastbourne's visitor economy is set to become all year round and Terminus Road will come alive at night as Victoria Place fizzes with excitement."



























Green light for new cycling and walking plan

A BLUEPRINT for how the county council could make active travel more convenient for everyday journeys has been approved.

The council's East Sussex
Local Cycling and Walking
Infrastructure Plan, which
proposes an ambitious network
of preferred cycling and walking
routes across the county, was
agreed by Cabinet.

Cllr Claire Dowling, lead member for transport and environment at *East Sussex County Council*, said: "Cycling and walking can have huge benefits to people's health and wellbeing, as well as improving air quality and reducing carbon emissions.

"We are keen to put infrastructure in place to encourage people to find more active and healthy ways to travel, and approval of this plan is another step towards achieving that goal."

She added: "This is a document that will evolve with schemes coming forward as and when external funding becomes available, at which point detailed design work and a thorough consultation will take place."

The plan, which at this stage does not include detailed proposals, will build on the active travel measures already delivered through the council's local transport capital programme and active access for growth programme.



Delivery of the plan relies on the council and their partners securing external funding to develop and deliver future schemes.

Cllr Dowling continued: "This is a long-term project and the plan will be regularly reviewed and updated to take into account the views of our residents, and to make sure it continues to support active travel while reflecting the needs of local communities.

"Having a plan in place puts us in a stronger position to secure future investment for the successful delivery of an expanded walking and cycling network across the county."

In line with guidance from the Department for Transport, the county's

first plan focuses on areas where there is the greatest opportunity to increase levels of cycling and walking and therefore, to attract external funding, such as the coastal strip and larger market towns in the county.

In rural areas, the council will look at how walking and cycling can be supported through its local transport plan, as well as local and neighbourhood plans. Officers will continue to work with local partners to identify opportunities and funding for active travel.

Urology team exceed participant recruitment target for research

THE Urology team at ESHT have been praised for their outstanding contribution to a research study by exceeding their participant recruitment target.

Mr Moore said: "It is quite an achievement, and most experts thought this kind of surgical trial was not possible to recruit to. Urinary incontinence after prostatectomy has a considerable affect on men's quality of life.

"The MASTER study shows that if surgery is needed, both surgical

options result in fewer symptoms and high satisfaction, despite most men not being completely dry. However, most other results indicate that men having an artificial urinary sphincter have better outcomes than those who have a sling."



Wealden's high streets flourish

HIGH streets across Wealden market towns and villages are bucking national trends and recovering well from the pandemic, say local experts.

And there is high demand for commercial property when it becomes available.

With larger towns and cities continuing to struggle with reduced footfall and empty premises, Wealden's smaller market towns and villages have benefited from the strong support of their residents, aided by the free car parking provided by Wealden District Council.

Whilst the structural impacts of online shopping and COVID lockdowns have been well documented, the need for social distancing, the preference for outdoor living and more people working from home have all led to a resurgence of people visiting their local high streets.

Recent research on shop vacancies in East Sussex shows levels were higher



in 2015 than they are now in spite of the lockdowns, said Chris Lawson of Lawson Commercial.

Another factor is that whilst many independent retailers do not have online stores, Wealden high street businesses are using social media and online community groups to connect with customers.

Uckfield has the highest rate of businesses actively using social media at 52%, closely followed by Crowborough and Hailsham at 46%. These businesses are also taking

advantage of local news sites which offer low-cost advertising opportunities.

Wealden District Council leader Bob Standley said, "There is much to gain from us all using our local high streets. It boosts our local economy, supports independent businesses and provides local jobs. It also gives our towns and villages a community hub, which is so important for our wellbeing. I would urge everyone to do their Christmas shopping locally this year and support Wealden's high streets. Let's all shop mindfully and buy local!"







The novel asks 'What if ...?'

I started by asking him about the setting for his new book.

"Half the book paints a picture of contentment in Eastbourne as we know it. Three elderly people meet every Friday afternoon to play Scrabble in one of their homes near the sea front.

"The other half features the same people living an alternative history, in an Eastbourne under Islamist rule following the 9/11 attacks in 2001."

In a series of alternating chapters, the lives of the threesome, one in freedom, the other in oppression, are played out in parallel.

I asked Edward what brought him to this subject.

"There were several motivations. First was Col Gaddafi's 2010 prediction that Europe would eventually be taken over by Islamic control.

"The second was Michel Houllebecq's novel *The Submission*, in which he envisaged a similar occupation in France."

Edward has based his novel on very personal experience.

"The main motive arose from having served two tours of work in the cradle of Islam.

"While working in Dhahran at the time of the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait, I was ejected from Saudi Arabia for writing an article for the *Eastbourne Herald*. I had been looking for an opportunity to reproduce aspects of that personal experience in fiction and now in flashback I have done so more than 30 years later."



Green and pleasant

NOVEMBER is here, the clocks have gone back, the leaves are falling and it's getting colder and wetter. As autumn turns to winter, the main jobs in the garden are mostly about protecting plants and structures from the wilder weather which will inevitably arrive. Move plants into the greenhouse, or into a sheltered spot, but if you can't, it is worth wrapping them. Remember winter can be a tough time for birds in terms of water and food, so keep supplies well topped up.

If you love a blast of colour with tulips in the spring, then now is the time to plant your bulbs in containers and borders to guarantee that amazing display. Remember to cover them with at least twice their depth of soil or compost! The effort put in now will pay dividends next year!

Autumn colour

There are many plants and shrubs that provide great autumn colour in the garden. One in particular at Driftwood at the moment is pictured in the header. It is a stunning coprosma, "Pacific Sunset". While it is an evergreen shrub, the colour deepens at this time of the year. It

has striking bronze leaves, splashed with cream, green and red and they look sensational in a border or large container. I've got 3 plants, 2 in a raised bed and one in a container which I've had for several years now. It prefers a sheltered spot, in moist but well-drained soil. I recently bought another variety called "Pacific Night" which is really frost tender. The coprosma is also called the looking glass plant!

A few other great autumn plants to have in the garden are beautiful asters which bring welcome late colour to gardens at this time of the year. Cotoneasters also provide a stunning display of beautiful berries in the autumn too and the birds love them as well. They grow in a herringbone pattern which make them great for training up a wall or over the ground.

Preparing for the first frost

It is always difficult to get the timing right, ensuring everything is safe and sound in the garden prior to the first frosts every year! Prime tasks should be to lift and store dahlias, cannas and begonia tubers that are planted out in flower beds or containers. All the guides say lift after the first frost and store the tubers carefully. The experts say dahlia tubers must remain dry but not dry out completely. Place in a dry, frost-free environment, evenly spaced in a tray or box and fill with sawdust, spent dry compost or vermiculite. I've covered mine with cardboard or you can add an extra quilt if you live in a colder climate.

Pansies

Last autumn I planted many pansies in the garden. Normally I would take them out as I planted my summer annuals. This year though, they were still performing so well, I left them throughout the summer amongst my displays! This time of the year is the perfect time to plant some. Pansies have the incredible ability to survive freezing winter temperatures and come out strong in the spring season. However, they can only be so resilient if they're planted at the proper time and in an ideal setting. Aim for a planting spot that will get about six hours of full sun each day. Pansies can grow in partial shade but will sprout best with ample sunlight. They should be wellwatered right after planting to get them off to a good start. Take care to water the plant's soil and avoid wetting the flowers and leaves, which could attract disease. A layer of mulch added to the pansy plant bed will help prevent any cold weather damage come winter.

November tasks

Here's a few suggestions on things to do in the garden this month providing the weather is in your favour! If, like me, you have potted chrysanthemums in the garden, keep them moist and do remember to deadhead them regularly in order to keep the flowers coming as long as possible. If growing cyclamen, remove leaves that are yellowing, along with the faded flowers, by pulling them from the corm. To prevent leaves from turning yellow it is best to keep them in a cool and bright place. Check on your potted plants that are kept for flowering over winter and ensure they have enough water. For dormant plants being overwintered in a frost-free place you will need to cut down on the watering.

I've already picked all my fruit growing in the garden but if you have yet to collect yours, now is the time to do it. Pick ripe apples and, depending on the variety, either eat or store in a cool, dry place for later in the year. I tend to peel and poach all mine, then freeze in containers for use throughout the winter months, in pies and crumbles. I've also got a conference pear tree, that has produced good fruit too and have done the same with them. I've found the crop of apples this year has been one of the best and the size of the fruit has been larger than usual as well.






