The Lord Lieutenant of East Sussex, Mr. Andrew Blackman, joined the celebrations with a formal ribbon cutting to welcome the guests into the office to see where the magic happens. Also in attendance was the Mayor of Eastbourne, councillor Pat Rodohan, and deputy Lieutenant as well as patron for the charity Mrs Juliet Smith JP DL.

Long-term stability

Music by The Rolling Sea's Ukulele band welcomed guests to the forecourt, as founder Chris Downton said a few words to thank all the amazing people who not only donated, but supported the charity in its endeavour to make 4 The Triangle its permanent base. This is hugely significant for the charity as the building provides long-term stability to staff and volunteers, as well as the families it supports, removing rental costs which means funds can instead be directed straight to where they are needed most — children with cancer.

The local community came together to find out about what goes on in the day-today running of the charity, which has recently involved a trip to *Drusillas*, mini golfing, random acts of kindness sending families off to their first concerts together, and afternoon tea deliveries straight to their front doors.

Help mark the occasion

Things have come a long way from the original kitchen table in 1998, but the charities mission and purpose remain the same. CWCF will continue to fight childhood cancer as they know best, supporting families when they need it, helping with the small things like buying school uniforms, providing parking permits for hospital trips, organising mini breaks away to offer respite from the effects of treatment, and bringing families together to create memories.

As the charity looks ahead to next year, they will be turning 25 years old, and with this they are looking to get together 25 groups or companies/businesses to hold events to mark each year of supporting families with cancer. 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

Employment support can help Eastbourne Foodbank

EASTBOURNE Foodbank explores the options for people able to work and helps answer questions about how employment affects benefits.

guests out of crisis

Helping people out of crisis and reducing their need to access emergency food is top of the priority list for Eastbourne Foodbank. Finding ways to maximize the incomes of foodbank guests is a large part of our work but those first steps into employment can be tough and there are bound to be questions. Here are some of the most common concerns:

I'm not in work and I am feeling isolated and low in confidence. I think employment could help, but I feel out of touch, don't have a CV and I just don't know where to start. Can I get support with the process?

Yes you can! The good news is there is plenty of support available in Eastbourne and we signpost to agencies, such as People Matter, SCDA and Possability People, which help prepare you

for the process both practically and emotionally. Entering the world of work can be a very frightening prospect but with the right support, employment can boost, not only your income, but also your mental wellbeing and give you a feeling of purpose through social interaction - helping to reduce feelings of isolation and low confidence.

I receive benefits and I'm worried they will be cut completely and I won't be any better off in employment, maybe even worse off. Is that true?

It is absolutely not true that your benefits will be stopped completely. In fact, DWP data for May 2022 shows more than 40 per cent of people on Universal Credit were in employment – that's a total of 2,255,603 working people using Universal Credit to top-up their income.* In fact, there are a number of people already in employment, on lower incomes, who could be missing out on benefits because they're unaware they are eligible. There are several free websites to help calculate your entitlement.

Most people will be financially better off if they are working, but it may not be by a huge amount. However, if you are able to work, employment could have a positive impact on your wellbeing and your pocket.

I have children and I'm convinced I won't be able to afford the child care I need to go out to work. What options are available to me?

Expense considerations are important when starting a new job and for people with dependent children, childcare is often top of that list. Parents of pre-school children aged between three and four can apply for up to 30-hours free childcare. For school aged children, you can apply for Tax-Free Childcare to get a top-up of up to £2,000 per year, per child until the September after your child turns 11. If a child has a disability this top-up doubles to £4,000 and is available until your child turns 16. For *Universal Credit*, you can claim back up to 85 per cent of the cost of childcare, if you're in work and your children are under

16, up to a maximum of £646 for one child and £1,108 for two or more children – but you will only be reimbursed after your childcare has taken place.**

Promoting employment and encouraging foodbank guests to check their eligibility for benefits are two of the approaches Eastbourne Foodbank advocates use to help reduce poverty and hunger in our town. We want to work towards an end for the need for foodbanks but with an increasing amount of working families in crisis across the UK, we know these efforts will not be enough to change what is expected to be a very bleak winter. Eastbourne Foodbank will continue to support people through this tough time, but a foodbank parcel won't pay the fuel bill. We believe a change in policy is needed to make sure people have enough money to afford the basics.

Two huge steps forward for the Borough

THERE have been two massive developments at Eastbourne Borough FC in the past few weeks — and both are incredibly positive.



First, following a new stadium sponsorship agreement, its stadium is now named *The SO Legal Stadium at Priory Lane*.

This new and exciting sponsorship deal will initially run until the end of the 2023/24 season.

SO Legal is a local firm of solicitors with offices across the South East, and now expanding into the North West of the country.





SO Legal was established in Eastbourne in 2016 and takes its name from the company's two founders, Hamed Ovaisi and Jamie Salvidge.

"Hamed and Jamie are both huge football fans, and already known to some supporters," said Chairman Dave Blackmore.

"It is fabulous to have them and their company supporting the club with this agreement. Priory Lane will always, of course, be Priory Lane in the hearts and minds of our supporters. We've simply added a dimension. Stadium naming agreements, common across football, are a brilliant way of raising our profile alongside our new naming partners. Everyone wins. I know that Hamed, Jamie and their colleagues are as excited as we are about this new partnership."

Second, Eastbourne Borough and Eastbourne Boxing Club have announced a major new project. The two clubs have entered detailed discussions and come up with firm plans to build a new state-of-the-art gym and fitness centre at the SO Legal Stadium at the Lane.

It would be built at the eastern end of the ground — the "River End" to Sports stalwarts and would include a viewing area on to the football pitch,

rather similar to the Mick Green Stand at the opposite end.

But this project will include very much more, in terms of fitness and training facilities beyond simply boxing.

A Joint Venture Vehicle has been set up, led by Borough vice-chairman Paul Maynard and Boxing Club chairman Adam Haniver.

Paul explains: "With professional support from England Boxing, Sport England and similar bodies the JVV will apply for funding, supplemented by crowd and other fundraising initiatives to plan for, design and build a bespoke boxing and fitness gym on land owned by EBFC.

"This will include a gymnasium on a first-floor mezzanine, a matted exercise space, a coffee shop (manned or automated), a merchandise shop/ office area, male and female changing rooms, youth changing rooms and one or more meeting rooms for use by both organisations. The boxing gym will be on the ground floor, and overlooked by the mezzanine."

The centre's design will be influenced by similar state-of-the-art facilities such as the *British Army Boxing Centre* in Aldershot (pictured below).



Return of the sleeper trains

LIKE everyone else, it has been no travelling abroad for me during the pandemic, so I was at last pleased to rectify things with a short trip to France last month. It was certainly good to see everything back to normal without any forms to complete and not even a request to show my proof of vaccinations, and the only one difference was actually having my passport stamped.

I did suggest last month that if going away for just a few days, a cabin bag might be best to avoid any baggage delays, but I need to add that with recent changes, a standard cabin bag is now charged extra. Easyjet have started charging around £65 for a case brought into the cabin that is anything greater than a very small one that fits under the seat in front of you. This is unfortunately a retrograde step that is likely to be followed by other airlines, as they are all wanting to make their fare look cheaper.

Overnight sleeper services

No such issues with rail travel which is certainly increasing in popularity and with many new services, it is a more enjoyable way of getting to the nearer European destinations. After a gap of over twenty years, the French have reintroduced some of their overnight sleeper services and one such train goes overnight to the Cote d'Azur so that you wake up looking out over the glistening Mediterranean — a great start to the holiday.

I don't know if we shall ever see a return to the other rail service — the 'Car Sleeper Express' which used to operate. This was a great way to take your car on the continent and saving the long drive south, so



you simply take your car with you on the train and sleep overnight arriving fresh the following morning. I believe that it was the cheap flights that put an end to this service, but with fares increasing and more importantly, car hire rates showing new high tariffs, we might still see a return of these trains.

Winter sunshine

The summer seems to have zipped past already and anytime soon we shall be getting our winter sunshine brochures and although it is not intended to sound somewhat glib, with all the gloom talked about energy prices, a week or two away from home during the colder months does give an added benefit in the saving on home heating.

Now West of the bandstand, the 'giant' two-metre-high letters first appeared in December at the Eastbourne Winterland and have been touring the town at surprise locations since then.

Christina Ewbank of Eastbourne unLtd Chamber of Commerce

said: "They have pride of place on Eastbourne promenade near the Wish Tower, and will soon be found in Victoria Place, at the seafront end of Terminus Road.

"They will remain on the seafront throughout the summer so that people can take selfies and photos with the love letters and share them on social media using the hashtag #IloveEBN. There's also a chance to win a prize of £250 for the best picture."

The giant letter installation is a joint project between Eastbourne Hospitality Association, the Eastbourne Shed in Fort Lane and VisitEastbourne.

The letters have been crafted by the people at Eastbourne Shed, an Age Concern scheme which brings together a community of individuals aged 50+ to work on woodwork projects - as well as help tackle loneliness and dementia with community initiatives.

The council said the letters were made using recycled wood including used wood from the groynes along Eastbourne seafront.

Cheaper Travel on Stagecoach Buses





Hope's inspiring daily swims for brain tumour charity

A BRAIN tumour patient from Pevensey has inspired dozens of people to join her for a daily swim in the sea to raise money for charity.

Hope Louise, a former Wetherspoons manager of 22 years, was diagnosed with a meningioma in June 2012 after suffering with double vision, tiredness, headaches, and pain in her eyes.

A month later she underwent a 12-hour surgery to have the tumour removed and has been having regular check-ups ever since.

She remains stable but continues to suffer with double vision because of the nerves in her eyes being severed. She also has neuralgia as a result of a brain injury she sustained but finds cold water immersion helps to some extent.


Pevensey Plungers

The mother-of-two co-founded *The Pevensey Plungers* in November last year.

The group, which brings people together every morning to experience the therapeutic benefits of coldwater immersion, has developed a large following, with more than 200 people attending its monthly full moon plunges and thousands more following their activities online.

Inspired by her own experience with brain tumour, which started ten years ago, Hope took on the *Brain Tumour Research* Charity's Swim Challenge in August to help find a cure for the disease.

After deciding to swim 10km throughout the month, the 47-year-old decided to turn her morning



Hope, who is now aiming to raise at least £2,740, said: "I saw the challenge and thought 'right, I'm going to swim'.

Help of others

"I'd only plunged before so thought I'd swim to the buoy every day I could and within a month I'd reach the 10km easily enough, but I didn't expect other people to join in, which has been lovely.

"No one goes out alone; it's like having a whole other family.

"I'd thought I'd raise maybe £200 and anything more would be a bonus but within five days I'd reached £500 and now I'm over £1,000, with the help of others.

"One lady baked cakes and made £45 for me by selling them on the beach whilst another created a painting called 'sea goddess' and auctioned it off for £60.

"Everyone's got involved and it's really blown my mind.

"I know so many people who haven't been as lucky as me, many of whom were younger than I was.

"Brain tumours seem to get forgotten about often but they're so common and there are so many different types that we need to do more to understand them.

Future research

"I'm grateful I'm alive and know I wouldn't be here today if it wasn't for past research, so I want to support future research and help to raise more awareness."





When did you last check your phone or laptop posture?

ASK someone to take a picture of your front, back and side posture or look in a mirror to check if you are aligned correctly.

Then repeat the exercise and make sure you're sitting up straight. If possible, make sure the back of your head and whole back is against the backrest of the chair.

Top Tips: Vary your posture and keep moving a few minutes every hour.

When reading or looking at your phone, bring the object up to you instead of looking down. This will help keep your neck straight.

As well as these general posture tips you can also take more specific action. You can stretch the tight muscles and/or strengthen the weak muscles to help ease tension and increase endurance during posture.

The muscles to work on are:

Trapezius — On top of your shoulders and in between your shoulder blades. The upper ones are often tight and the middle and lower ones are often weak.

These shrug the shoulders and move the shoulder blade. To relieve the tension on the upper traps, sit up straight, drop your shoulders down and move your forearms outwards, making sure the shoulder blades are squeezed together.

You can do this with a resistance band. Hold the band in your hands and bring your arms outwards. Do this 15 times.

Serratus Anterior – Located just below the armpit on the ribs.

To strengthen these, get either a weight (2-5kg) or water bottle, lie

face up and hold the weight/water bottle up, keeping your arm straight and in line with the shoulder then reach upwards towards the ceiling, keeping your arm straight. Repeat 10 times each side.

Scalenes – These muscles lift up the top two ribs during breathing. Often tight due to breathing with our upper chest instead of our abdomen.

To stretch these, tilt your head to one side, rotate your head to the opposite side you are tilting, then tilt your chin up and hold for 30 seconds. You should feel a stretch at the side of the neck. Repeat twice more each side.

If any of the above exercises causes pain, discontinue them and talk to your Chiropractor or other spine care professional.

Dealing with anxiety

It is quite normal to feel anxious from time to time, but when it becomes a regular feeling on a daily basis, it can become an automatic response or a habit.

The degree of anxiety varies from person to person. It is quite a natural reaction. Anxiety is normally based in the future, as it's a fear of something to come. This means that if you are disconnected from the present moment. It may be triggered by

worrying about the future, you are anything that takes you out of your







comfort zone, which is where familiarity lies and you feel safe.

Being labelled as anxious by a doctor, parents, other family members, friends, and teachers or even by you telling yourself that you are an anxious person reinforces the issue. You believe that's who you are and you become stuck. What you believe you create, so begins a life of being an anxious person. However, no amount of anxiety or stress will change what is going to happen. You can't worry yourself to a solution. Finding some peace and calm will help you to free yourself and enable you to cope and move through whatever challenges life brings your way.

What triggers anxiety?

When there is a regular heightened emotion of anxiety, there is often a trigger that comes from the past. Sometimes, it is a major trauma that you will be consciously aware of but it may come from something that appears to be much less significant and which you may not even be aware has caused such a response. Just as an example, perhaps you were frightened to go on stage at school at young age. It certainly wasn't a pleasant experience and you may have virtually forgotten it. However the body remembers that feeling and when anything happens that even remotely feels the same way.

Ways to overcome anxiety

1. Bring yourself back to the present moment. Anxiety is in the future, so often in that feeling you are disconnected from the present. In the present moment you are actually OK. Keep reminding yourself of that.

- 2. Find ways to relax and feel calm. Try meditation. There are videos on YouTube and apps available.
- 3. Focus on your breathing and take deep breaths. Use calming breathing exercises.
- 4. Talk about how you are feeling to a family member or friend.
- 5. Write down whatever is bothering you. Don't think about it, just put pen to paper. You may find solutions coming to you as you write freely.
- 6. Exercise or do activities that may help you to relax.
- 7. Seek help from a professional who can work with you to release the emotion and give you strategies to cope for the future.

In every moment you have a choice. You may feel anxiety is in control, but you can take your power back any time you want.

Spend that time and energy focussing on what you want to positively happen.

Market returning to normal seasonal patterns

THE average price for a house has fallen for the first time this year.

The average asking price for a home fell 1.3 per cent — or £4,795 — to £365,173 in August.

It marks the first month-on-month drop this year, says property site *Rightmove*.

Tim Bannister, director of property science, said that sellers who need

to move quickly tend to price 'competitively' at this time of year.

He said: "A drop in asking prices is to be expected this month as the market returns towards normal seasonal patterns after a frenzied two years, and many would-be home movers become distracted by the holidays."

Demand for property from first-time buyers was still 32 per cent higher than at the same time in 2019.





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




Living on the edge

THE East Sussex-based artist, David Blandy, will present an exhibition at *Towner Eastbourne* this September featuring new video work shot around the Eastbourne area and in the South Downs, and an immersive cardboard installation created in collaboration with fine art students from *East Sussex College* Lewes.

The Edge of Forever (2022) will premiere at Towner from 20 September to 2 October 2022. The film centres on two questing children seeking to unravel the mysteries in a damaged, dystopian world. The journey begins at Cuckmere Haven, Sussex, with its cliffs formed from the remains of plankton from 100 million years ago, continues to a Cold War-era observatory and concludes with entrancing visions of the cosmos.

Our place in the world

In this work, Blandy investigates connections between specific sites, personal histories and geopolitical events to reflect on our place in the world. These ideas are tackled through the lens of his grandfather's experiences interred in Japanese POW camps during the Second World War in Singapore and Taiwan, merging the personal with larger shared histories.

These histories are intimately tied to the South Coast of England;

from the abandoned telescopes of *Herstmonceux Observatory* in Hailsham and the winding meanders of Cuckmere Haven, a landscape steeped in the history of World War Two; to the sci-fi of HG Wells that preempted many of our technological advances.

Soil, Sinew and Bone (2022) is a second new video work that features in the installation. Working with film footage from Screen Archive South East, spanning the 1930s to the 1970s, Blandy charts the protracted revolution from the age of horse power to the Cold

Residency at Towner

This work has been created as part of the artist's residency at *Towner* and alongside the two video works, Blandy will present his research into the relationship between food production, weapons development, space exploration and ecological disaster.

Multidimensional

The exhibition also includes a collaboration with Fine Art students from East Sussex College Lewes. The students worked closely with Blandy to create an outsized children's fantasy. Together they reimagined key scenes from the film, enlarged and built out of cardboard, from observatory domes, mangrove roots to figures, all rendered in the style of theatre flats, that will populate the ground floor Towner Studio spaces.

The artist has said, "I want to surround the viewer with multiple types of realities, from science fiction to collage poem to cardboard monoliths, to create a multidimensional set of stories that repeat and resonate with each other".

The Edge of Forever is supported by Arts Council England, Screen Archive South East and The Elephant Trust. This project will continue to be developed for a solo exhibition at John Hansard Gallery, Southampton in 2023.

Green and pleasant

LATE summer progresses into autumn. September is generally a cooler, gustier month than August and the days are noticeably shorter. While you may not have much to do in the bulk of the garden, if you have a fruit or vegetable patch, hopefully you'll be busy reaping the rewards of your harvest. It's also time to get out and start planting spring-flowering bulbs for next year and you can collect seeds for next summer's colour too. Make the most of the remaining warmth while you can!

At this time of the year, we can see the garden slowing down. Some herbaceous perennials and annuals have finished for the summer, others such as roses, sweet peas may keep on flowering. Exactly what is flowering when depends on the sort of spring and summer we have enjoyed, but there is plenty of late colour in the garden.

Planning ahead

September is a great month for some forward planning. You can begin to order and plant spring-flowering bulbs now, such as daffodils, crocus and hyacinths, providing glorious colour next year. Maybe think about how you want your garden to look next year. You can perhaps make rough sketches of your flower borders and

vegetable plot. This will help you spot what worked in your garden and what didn't! If you plan to plant new trees and shrubs, doing it now ensures they will grow vigorously next spring. Think back to what didn't work well for you and decide how best to avoid the same issues next year.

National Garden Scheme

This month sees the gardens opening for the scheme slow right down but there are a few you might like to get out to visit. A brand-new opening for 2022 is Hamsey House, Hamsey, opening on the 18th September between 1 and 5pm with entry £6. The garden is nestled within the South Downs National Park, just a few miles from Lewes. Hamsey House was built in 1849. The country garden incorporates an orchard with a wildflower patch, a vegetable and cut flower garden along with many established trees and shrubs. Plants for sale along with refreshments.

A second offering might be Knightsbridge House, Grove Hill in Hellingly. The garden will open on both the 7th and 10th of the month from 2pm to 5pm with entry £6. It is a mature, landscaped garden set in five acres of tranquil countryside, surrounding a Georgian house. See several garden rooms and spectacular herbaceous borders, planted in contemporary style in a traditional setting. Full details on both gardens can be found at www.ngs.org.uk

Buddleja

I have a small collection of buddlejas in the garden at *Driftwood*. Known as the butterfly bush, its fragrant flowers are a favourite nectar source for butterflies and bees. These undemanding, mainly deciduous shrubs, deserve a place in every garden with their spectacular displays of blooms and honey scent. Some selections are compact and can be grown in containers. The one shown in the header is one of these, buddleja 'Buzz Magenta' which is a dwarf patio buddleja that won't take over your garden. It will produce flowers the size of usual buddlejas, but the plants themselves are half the size. They are easy to grow and generally problem-free with a super long-flowering period. What's more, they are perfectly proportioned for patio pots and smaller gardens. I also have 'Buzz Lilac', 'Butterfly Heaven', 'Globosa' and a new one called 'Butterfly Candy Little Ruby'.

The 'Buddleja Buzz' series was a revolution in plant breeding and are sold in many garden centres across the country. They come in a variety of colours and flower all the way until October.

What to do with perennials as summer fades?

Some plants look good as they fade, such as sedum where the flower heads hold their own for weeks and look good with a dusting of frost. Others, such as Hosta look a mess. There is no hard and fast rule about what to do with herbaceous and perennial plants once summer is over.

Some gardeners cut everything back, clearing out the borders, and others leave plants uncut to encourage wildlife and cultivate a less formal look. There is also a halfway house; cut back plants that look a mess, such as Hosta, Crocosmia, Delphinium leaving in place those which still add to the border, at least for a while, which also spreads the work in the garden over the winter months. As with many aspects of gardening, there is no right or wrong it's down to personal preference. I tend to cut quite a lot back in my garden.

Macmillan Garden Trail update


