We're officially a Good school!

THIS is what OFSTED Inspectors said about Ratton:

- Relationships between teachers and pupils are strong and supportive. There is a positive working atmosphere around the school.
- Leaders have exceedingly high expectations and there is a strong culture of care. Pupils are happy and safe. They behave well. They show a pride in their school and their achievements. Any instances of bullying are quickly dealt with.
- Pupils can all name a trusted adult to speak with if they have any problems. Pupils appreciate the support of the school and value the provision of extra-curricular activities. This extensive programme covers sport, art, drama, dance, reading, science, languages and Irish dance. The school has also

- received an 'International Schools Award' in recognition of trips abroad including France, Germany, Italy, Japan and Uganda.
- The curriculum supports pupils to develop their understanding of fundamental British values. Pupils show respect for one another. They contribute to the school community through various leadership roles. They are well prepared for their future and actively supported in their choice of careers.
- Leaders and middle leaders have worked hard to construct a curriculum which is ambitious and meets the needs of all pupils. Links with partner primary schools are well developed to ensure curriculum continuity. Links with post-16 providers are developing.
- Disadvantaged pupils and pupils with special educational needs and/ or disabilities (SEND) are actively

- engaged in all aspects of school life. Teachers know these pupils well and adapt the curriculum to support them effectively. This allows them to quickly catch up on any work which they find challenging.
- The school continues to ensure that higher prior attainers are sufficiently challenged.
- The school is working hard to improve the uptake of languages.
 They have introduced numerous initiatives to encourage more pupils to develop a love of languages.
- Literacy and subject-specific vocabulary are well supported across the school. Reading has a high priority and additional reading support is offered to any pupils who fall behind. Relationships and sex education are carefully incorporated in ethics lessons.
- Teachers have strong subject knowledge. They use a wide range of assessment to provide helpful feedback to pupils.

- Behaviour and attitudes are secure across the school. Pupils have a strong understanding of diverse cultures and ethnicities.
 They recognise that, while racist comments are rare, there is some use of discriminatory language being used inappropriately.
 In lessons, pupils work with commitment and determination.
 Low-level disruption is not tolerated.
 Movement around the school is calm and orderly.
- Staff are incredibly positive about the leadership of the school. They feel their workload is suitably managed through sharing resources and working cooperatively. They say that their professional needs are well supported, and they are proud to be a member of staff.
- The 'achieving excellence' vision is clearly articulated through the school's virtues covering compassion, respect, creativity, teamwork, effort and responsibility.
 There is a strong focus on school

improvement which has been initiated by the headteacher and actively supported by the executive headteacher.

- Engagement with parents and carers is secure but some consider that communication is not sufficient.
- Governors and trustees have a good understanding of the school. They visit the school regularly and receive quality reports from senior leaders and other staff. Governors are keen and enthusiastic. Training offered by trustees, school leaders and outside agencies has ensured that they are now better equipped for their role.
- The arrangements for safeguarding are effective. There is a strong safeguarding culture throughout the school. Safeguarding issues are understood, and actions taken to support local issues such as knife crime and gangs. Pupils know how to keep themselves safe. They are knowledgeable about issues such as peer-on-peer abuse, upskirting and harmful sexual behaviour. The welfare, well-being and safety of all pupils is a high priority for the school. Staff receive regular safeguarding training and frequent updates. They know how to identify risks and what to do if they have any concerns. The single central record is compliant. Referrals to external agencies are made in a timely manner.





Ofsted says Ratton is still good

RATTON School is celebrating after being rated Good in a recent OFSTED inspection.

Head Gavin Peevers says it is a great team effort from pupils, staff, parents and carers after the challenges facing education from Covid.

Inspectors spent two days in the popular school on Park Avenue — and were clearly impressed with what they saw.

They spoke to pupils, staff and governors, and watched lessons being delivered in key subjects.

Their unanimous verdict is that *Ratton* remains a Good school.

It is part of the *South Downs*Learning Trust, along with *Ocklynge*Junior School in Victoria Drive.

Headteacher Gavin Peevers said: "This is a fantastic testament to all the effort, creativity and teamwork

of both staff and students in challenging circumstances during the last two years.

"I am particularly pleased that the inspection team recognised the 'exceedingly high expectations', the wide range of fantastic work that happens in our school community across the curriculum, student welfare and pastoral provision that undoubtedly results in our students 'showing a pride in their school and their achievements'."

Paul Murphy, executive headteacher, said: "I would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff, students, governors and families who work tirelessly on making *Ratton* the school it is."





Care to survive

EASTBOURNE & District Mencap is at the forefront for providing services for people with learning disabilities, however, despite our strong commitment and hard work to succeed, one of the main issues we have is recruitment.

The adult social care sector currently faces significant challenges with both the recruitment and retention of staff. Eastbourne Mencap, like many other providers find that it is difficult to recruit and retain staff due to the pressure on staff costs, such as payment of a living wage, training and support for career progression.

The greater use of agency staff has consequently increased the demand and cost significantly to an unsustainable level. We feel there needs to be some recognition by the Government as major changes are needed to increase pay across the social care sector.

High standards of care

Eastbourne Mencap is a small charity that has been providing a service to people with learning disabilities for over 70 years. We now need to evolve as an organisation and change our approach in order to continue to provide our service users with high standards of care. This will involve diversifying and introducing new revenue streams.

This will be challenging, as this situation means providers have to think outside the box to be able to survive

in this sector. Unfortunately, the last two years with the Covid-19 pandemic has set us back considerably with our business plan to generate increased income and sustain the overall costs to run our charity.

Raising awareness

We are fortunate to have been chosen as one of Eastbourne Mayor's charities this year, so we



are looking forward to working with The Mayor and Eastbourne Foodbank to raise awareness for our charities and much needed funds through various events during the year. These will be promoted on our website and social media profiles and our website also contains information about current vacancies, volunteering and all our news.

Marketing, fundraising, and advertising, together with project and social media management are now becoming part of the running of *Eastbourne Mencap*, placing the adult social care providers in a competitive gear in order to survive and do well.

New Leaf Café

Eastbourne Mencap is already involved with a Social Enterprise programme, 'New Leaf Café', working in partnership with Our Neighbourhood with funding from Devonshire West Big Local. Through this project we are able to generate an income and improve provisions in the local community. This gives our service users opportunities to learn new skills and service the general public and we hope to be involved with more projects like this.

Various commissioning bodies fund the majority of resident care packages and they have just 5% surplus to fund all their additional costs, including the upkeep of their beautiful building, upgrading their equipment, and to provide the extra social and recreational activities and services that enhance the comfort and well-being of their residents, which is why they rely on donations and fundraising.

Chaseley is an independent charityowned care home located in a stunning location on Eastbourne's seafront. It is a 55-bed home that specialises in long-term nursing and respite care for people with complex disabilities, such as Acquired and Traumatic Brain Injury, stroke, spinal cord injury and degenerative neurological conditions such as Multiple Sclerosis, Motor Neurone and Parkinson's disease.

Their multi-disciplinary approach to care and rehabilitation includes physiotherapy, occupational therapy and recreational activities, ensuring their person-centred approach is focused on individuals regaining as much independence as possible, so that their psychological wellbeing and emotional balance are maintained. In addition to this their facilities included an on-site, fully accessible gym specifically designed for people who are disabled and living in the community.

Foodbank campaign raises awareness of poverty and holds hope for a better future

EASTBOURNE FOODBANK is marking Challenge Poverty Week (October 17th to 23rd) by sharing stories of hardship and campaigning for a stronger social security system.

The cost of living crisis is plunging too many people into poverty but we, at the local foodbank, are holders of hope and we believe change is possible.

Alarming increase in foodbank numbers from 30 to 2,000 people each month

When Eastbourne Foodbank set up in 2011 it provided emergency food from a porta cabin for 30 people in one month. At that time,

foodbank CEO Howard Wardle thought he was providing short-term help and it couldn't possibly get any busier. Fast forward to today, and shockingly, we are feeding an average of 2,000 people every month and now have a 4,500 square foot warehouse, two vans, 130 volunteers, 15 paid members of staff and seven distribution points across the town to cope with the growing demand.

It's not right such huge numbers are in financial crisis, and

foodbanks should not be the answer to the cost of living crisis. However, we hear devastating stories every day and as a result we will continue to provide support to make sure people have essential items during some of the toughest times in their lives.

The vast majority of people are only one or two steps away from crisis. Being made redundant, the death of a partner, a serious illness or a relationship breakdown can happen to anyone.

A bereaved 59-year-old man told us life became very tough when he lost his long-term partner a few years ago. It was a very difficult time in his life, but as he started to deal with his grief and come to terms with the loss, his financial situation worsened as the cost of living increased. He is applying for work and currently claiming Universal Credit, but now can't afford the basics.

He said: "Never in a million years did I think I would need to use a foodbank — never in a million years! I'm good at budgeting and always thought I would be able to manage but it's just too much of a struggle.

"I have no money to do anything at all and it is isolating. My rent has to be my priority and I pay the majority of my bills, although that is a struggle because I can only chip away at the growing electricity bill debt.

"As far as food is concerned, with the help of the foodbank, I just get by.

"There is sometimes, if I'm lucky, around £20 left each month for other things. So, really I have no money for anything else. It can be very lonely. I have friends and they ask me to go to the pub to watch the football but I can't afford to get there and I can't afford to buy a drink."



A single mum-of-three visited the foodbank with her two youngest children in the summer holidays. Their cupboards and fridge were completely bare that morning and the youngest two children, aged three and nine, had empty tummies when they arrived.

They were given a slice of homemade cake for breakfast from the community café at the church while their mum selected her three days' worth of emergency food for the family. That day there were some fresh strawberries, past their best before date, and she was so pleased to take a pack home for her children.



She told us: "I wish I didn't have to bring the children to the foodbank but I am finding it hard through the summer holidays. They would usually get free school meals and it's so difficult.

"I receive Universal Credit monthly, but I would like to have it every two weeks because I'm finding it hard to make it stretch. Everything is getting more expensive — it is impossible! I have to visit the foodbank while I wait for the next monthly payment.

"I have some unpaid bills and a water bill debt that I just haven't been able to afford."

Jess Holliday, Campaigns and Communications Manager, said: "Foodbanks should not need to exist in 2022, here in one of the wealthiest countries in the world.

"We hold hope that life can and will improve for people living in poverty and, with some changes to government policy, less people will need to rely on foodbanks.

"We recently held a day of action and many people in Eastbourne

stood with us in these views. Foodbank representatives spoke to members of the public about their current fears and hopes for the future. We all agreed no-one's income should fall so dangerously low it doesn't cover the essentials we all need.

"As part of our campaigns work, in partnership with *The Trussell Trust*, we are calling for a better future and stronger social security system that supports people every day — not just in times of national crisis.

"We are taking this message of hope into school assemblies and churches during *Challenge Poverty Week*.



I HAVE recently experienced first-hand, the situation at both Gatwick and Heathrow, and following all the terribly negative press coverage a little while ago, I'm pleased to report that everything is now much better and going through the usual holdup of security was just a few minutes at Gatwick and just a little longer at Heathrow.

I never believe that airports are exactly the most enjoyable places to visit, and for me personally, the less time there the better, so for passengers who have checked-in online and just have cabin baggage, turning up an hour and a half before departure is more than adequate: three hours just means more hanging around.

We all want to get a good price for a flight and invariably, the earlier you book the better — opposite to what it was a number of years ago! We book a lot of flights and always have to navigate round the seemingly cheapest fare to establish the best one for what clients actually need. For example, some of the cheapest fares allow for no baggage in the hold or even in the cabin, have very unsocial departure times, and in the case of long-haul flights, have excessive waits of many hours between connecting flights.

Very few people these days enquire as to which airline or what aircraft they would be flying on, but it is always worth asking the question because it may be that just a small amount extra buys you some additional comfort because they are not necessarily the same. A good example is the different aeroplanes used, as travelling in a wide-bodied (i.e., two aisles) such as the Boeing 777 or 787 is more comfortable than



a single aisle Airbus 319/320 used by the likes of easyJet, and especially when equipped with seat back screens for on-board entertainment. A lot about flights this month, but of course unless you are cruising or going by rail, it is an important factor on most people's holidays. It is surprising how many people ask if we book flights, but to me it is like asking a publican if he sells beer!

Here we are in autumn again and the season that people look for winter sunshine holidays, and very soon we shall be receiving all the summer 2023 brochures and indeed we already have the latest details of cruises for the year after next. If you haven't been away yet this year, it's not too late, so if you are going soon I wish you a good trip.



My confidence hit an all-time low I didn't want anyone to see me because they didn't understand.



Chloe was just fourteen years old when she was diagnosed with Hodgkin Lymphoma, a type of blood cancer. Chloe and her family were supported by Children with Cancer Fund during and beyond her

In July 2013, I found a series of lumps in my neck. I had various doctor's appointments and my GP prescribed antibiotics, but the lumps remained. Eventually I had a biopsy and scans which confirmed that I had stage three Hodgkin Lymphoma. The doctors told my parents who then had to break the news to myself and my two sisters, we were devastated.

I started chemotherapy which was a gruelling experience, I lost all of my hair and gained a lot of weight because of the steroids I had to take each day. My confidence hit an all-time low - I didn't want anyone to see me because they didn't understand.

That's when children with cancer fund came into our lives, they invited us along to social events with other families affected by childhood cancer. This came at exactly the right time, we realised we weren't alone and there were others out there who understood exactly what we were going through.

I was very fortunate to go into remission in 2014, but the impact of my diagnosis didn't stop there. We were so used to being in the care of the Royal Marsden, that when treatment stopped we weren't sure how to start 'living' again, I experienced a lot of down days. This is where Children with Cancer Fund was amazing, they continued to invite us to social events and surprised me with treats when I was having a bad day. Knowing there was someone there for us through every part of our journey, was the reassurance we really needed.

I am so grateful for all of the treats, events and caravan breaks children with cancer fund gave us, thanks to them some of our darkest days were made that little bit easier.







Seminars





A helping hand for first-time buyers





Finding Sanctuary

THIS autumn, *Towner Eastbourne* will host *Brewers Towner International*, an exhibition of work by contemporary artists that address the theme of SANCTUARY, featuring a number of artists from East Sussex and Kent.

Brewers Towner International aims to recognise and appreciate how artists are reflecting and responding to the economic, political, cultural, and environmental changes that are unfolding in the contemporary moment and the places that have become a sanctuary throughout the pandemic, such as finding solace in the studio, the home and the landscape.

Following an open call, 23 artists – based locally and internationally – were selected by an esteemed panel including Elizabeth Price (Turner Prize-winning artist), Sepake Angiama (Artistic Director, Iniva), and Noelle Collins (Exhibitions & Offsite Curator, Towner Eastbourne). The resulting exhibition brings together a community of artists, makers and storytellers, examining subjects as varied as pattern, memory, identity and the migratory experience.

Seeking asylum

Paintings and drawings exploring ideas of memory, trauma, healing and collaboration will be exhibited alongside newspaper clippings embellished with floral patterns

- transforming images of fear and violence into imaginary ecosystems. Considerations of the natural environment and its resilience are captured in large-scale paintings of a WWII-era pillbox engulfed by tree roots on the banks of the Medway river. Sculptural installations responding to architectural histories and ideas of exposure, vulnerability, light and shadow, will be shown alongside photographs of cinnamon stick structures reflecting childhood memories of Morocco and feelings of homesickness. Locations along the Sussex coast will feature in a

series of works on paper, based on local landing points for those seeking asylum.

The Brewers Towner Award of £10,000, sponsored by Brewers Decorator Centres, will also be given to one of the exhibiting artists alongside mentoring from the

Towner team. The recipient of this prestigious award will be announced at a special reception for media and invited guests prior to the exhibition's opening party, which takes place on 22 October at 7pm to which everyone is welcome.

In the exhibition, Akingbade presents a duo of films: 55 Days (2022) and Red Soleil (2021); these works reflect the aspirations and ambitions of an emerging artist navigating the challenges and opportunities of daily life. 



Green and pleasant

I REALLY can't believe we are already in October. This year just seems to have flown by, with my many garden visitors long gone and now I'm starting to get ready to put the garden to bed. October is a beautiful month of stunning autumnal colours and possibly the first frosts. Its crisp, blue-sky days are the perfect time to get outside and tidy up and cut back where necessary in the garden. Meanwhile, if you grow fruit and vegetables, there's probably still plenty to harvest and store for the cold winter months ahead.

At the end of the month, 30th October, the clocks go back, meaning even less daylight hours to spend outdoors. It is the month to think about protecting half-hardy plants with fleece or move them into a frost-free greenhouse. Make sure you sweep up any fallen leaves that harbour fungal spores and provide ideal hiding places for slugs and snails.

Driftwood in 2022

I've been raising money for charity, notably, Macmillan Cancer Support and the National Garden Scheme, since 2009. The bulk of the money has been raised through the Macmillan Coastal Garden Trail, which I have single-handedly, organised from 2012. I have now made the very difficult decision

that this years' trail was the final one. I celebrate my 70th birthday next year and with my failing knees, feel I need to relinquish some of my commitments in order ease the workload and to focus more on my own plot.

This summer I have seen over 700 visitors to *Driftwood* through June, July and August, 84 from the *National Garden Scheme*, 234 during the final trail weekend and over 400 who either saw the garden through the *BBC Gardeners' World* 2for1 scheme or booked having read the amazing reviews on *Trip Advisor*.

The net effect of so many people ringing to arrange to see *Driftwood* has meant another record year of charity fundraising. Last year we raised £14,900 with several public days included and have still managed £12,231 this year, having relied solely on private visits.

Those who visited the garden this summer will have seen the new sunken garden, which has gone down a storm with new and returning guests. Don't miss a visit in 2023 to see what I'm doing with the pond area over the winter months. The aim is to create an easier environment to look after and more importantly, incorporate plants that are more drought tolerant. In 2023 the garden will open from 1st June through until 11th August, raising money for both the National Garden Scheme and Macmillan Cancer support again. Follow the work being undertaken this winter on Geoff's website.

National Garden Scheme

This month see the last of the gardens opening for the scheme until 2023, with the majority across in West Sussex. The Old Vicarage in Washington opens on the first two Thursdays, 6th and 13th, from 1030 to 430pm with entrance £7, here visitors can wander around three and a half acres of beautiful garden. Peelers Retreat at 70 Ford Road in Arundel opens from 2-5pm on two Tuesdays, 4th and 11th with entry £5 This is a stunning garden with gift shop and imaginative woodland sculptures. Denmans Garden, in Denman's Lane, Fontwell, opens on the 29th October from 10am to 4pm with entry £9 and children £7. Enjoy year-round colour and unusual plants. The next NGS update will be for snowdrop and hellebore gardens in early 2023. Full details on all gardens at www.ngs.org.uk

October jobs in the garden

There is certainly lots to be getting on with in the garden this month, I've been lifting my dahlia tubers, but now is the time to lift begonia tubers and gladioli corms too and to store them over the winter months. Remember to remove any dead foliage before putting them away.

This time of the year is perfect, as the soil is still warm, to lift and divide any overcrowded herbaceous perennials you might have around the garden. I've certainly got plans to split some persicaria, which seems to be taking over. If you have any, prune rambling and climbing roses, once they've finished flowering, and tie in the stems before autumn winds cause potential damage.

After tidying borders, mulch with bark chips, well-rotted manure, leaf mould or spent mushroom compost, this will help to insulate the plant roots for the winter and also keep weed growth in check.

I've got quite a few apples growing in my garden, as seen in the header photo. I have two trees, the one pictured and a small Cox's Orange Pippin too. An easy way of testing when they are ripe is to gently lift them in the palm of your hand or give them a gentle pull, if you do this, they should come away easily. I've got quite a good crop again, so will be busy peeling them and cooking to store in the freezer through the winter to use in crumbles and pies. I also have a pear tree but the fruit crop has not been good this year.
