





"My ask of you is simple. Please consider supporting my *JustGiving* page and sharing it.




"It would be wonderful to raise the awareness of this Neuroendocrine Cancer, (NETS) in the hope that others are diagnosed more quickly.



## Volunteer with us...

#### ...IT may be the most fulfilling thing that you have ever done.

Eastbourne Samaritans Director David Smith is inviting you join our family of 90 listening volunteers and 15 support volunteers.

"We offer a free training course over 4 which will take around two months over evenings and weekends and then as a volunteer you will be supported in our duty room with a mentor. We all find the role very fulfilling and often we are the only service that is available to simply listen to a caller without judgement or advice.

Becoming a Samaritan gives you new life skills, enables you to make new friends and you can also participate at local events in Eastbourne including the Arlington Bluebell Walk, Eastbourne Carnival or visits to schools and prisons."

Eastbourne Branch answers over 20,000 calls per year and nearly 90% of these calls involves a conversation around emotional support. Roughly 1/4 of our callers have had suicidal thoughts or are suicidal and 10% have been or are self-harming.

We are a lifeline to many of our callers who often have no one else to talk to.

Our service is simple and follows five key principles:

- **Listening** exploring feelings to alleviate distress.
- **Confidentiality** if people feel safe, they are more likely to be open about their feelings.
- **Non-judgemental** whatever your views or your situation, we listen without fear or prejudice.
- Self-determination people have the right to find their own solution. We help our callers work things out. We don't offer advice.
- Human contact We give our time and undivided attention with empathy in order to help reduce distress and despair.

## Guarantee Our Essentials

#### **BENEFITS** should cover our essentials: Eastbourne Foodbank campaigns.

Eastbourne Foodbank is backing the Joseph Rowntree Foundation and The Trussell Trust's Essentials Guarantee campaign and was on the panel at the parliamentary launch.

#### Protecting people from destitution

Currently, the amount of *Universal* Credit people receive is not linked to the prices of items we all need, and is leaving people desperately short. The Essentials Guarantee campaign lists the minimum amounts an adult would need today to afford the essentials, based on the current costs. It includes £37 a week for food, £35 for gas and electric and £8 for communications, such as mobile phone and internet.

The aim of this campaign is to ask each political party to include the pledge to introduce an objective measure for calculating *Universal* Credit levels in their election manifestos, ahead of the 2024 general election.

#### Stories from Eastbourne in **Parliament**

Jess Holliday, Eastbourne Foodbank campaigns and communications manager, travelled up to the *Houses* of Parliament for the national launch of the campaign. Jess spoke to the packed committee room, which included Eastbourne MP Caroline Ansell, about foodbanks. Jess shared our clients' stories at the launch, which aimed to build cross-party consensus among MPs to create a stronger social security system and ensure we can all afford the essentials.

Jess said: "I was humbled to be given the opportunity to speak and be on the panel at the parliamentary launch of this very important campaign."

#### No-one should be forced to use a foodbank

less added: "Demand for foodbanks has never been so high. At Eastbourne Foodbank, we believe it is not right that so many people are being forced to visit foodbanks and we hold hope the situation can and will change for people living in poverty.

"If each political party commits to guaranteeing our essentials, the need for foodbanks will hugely decrease. We would be there for crisis and emergency – but we would be able to close the door on such large-scale foodbanks. That is our ultimate aim."



#### OHM Energy and kayak manufacturer make a sustainability splash

Since the pandemic, paddling has seen dramatic growth. When we were allowed out, many of us on the South Coast wanted to be near or on water. The rising popularity of paddle sports has resulted in **British Canoeing seeing a 127%** increase in membership over the last two years.

However, this surge of interest has come at the same time as increased overheads spike for the watersports industry. Many businesses are still suffering from global supply issues as well as spiralling costs across the board, especially in energy and manufacturing uses large quantities of energy. As the price per unit of energy has risen, overheads have shot up for the paddling world.

Uckfield-based manufacturer, Gaybo Ltd trading as Wave Sport, has been making high-end kayaks since 1968. Today, recognised as one of

the longest-standing businesses in the sector, the company has found a solution to help mitigate some of these increased costs and they are blazing the trail for the kayaking industry.

In February, Wave Sport installed 422 x 420W Trina solar panels for their purpose-built factory and has generated around 4MW of free solar energy in 10 days to help power operations, saving 4 tonnes of carbon dioxide in the process.

Wave Sport Director, Andre Goldsmith, says "We are excited to see what impact the solar has once the weather improves. So far we have seen reductions in our pull from the grid and the occasional short periods when we are in fact totally off-grid and operating under the power generated by our solar installation. We are carefully analysing our power generation



vs usage but it is too early to say exactly how much we will see our bills reduce ... so far we are putting our faith in the theoretical calculations that we have the potential to halve our energy bills over the course of a year.

Paul Vine, Director of local renewable energy firm, OHM Energy adds "Wave Sport has made an

investment in their business and the environment, and at current energy prices, they should recover their investment within about four years. These solar panels have warranties for over 20 years and are predicted to save 1,795 tonnes of CO<sup>2</sup> saved over that period. Going solar was not only a pioneering move for Wave Sport but also a smart commercial and ethical decision.'

#### Local business mum wins mini first aid Franchise of the year



Local business mum. Jen Fisher. and owner of Mini First Aid Sussex has been on a mission to promote first aid for the whole family. As a mother to a young child, Jen launched her business in September 2020 to

offer 2 hour baby and child first classes to local families but she didn't want to stop there. The business quickly grew Sussex wide and added first aid classes for children, businesses, and early years settings.

Jen's passion has seen her raise money for good causes, work with local schools and businesses and promoting support for women in business with her Mums in Business Eastbourne, Bexhill & Hastings group. Jen wants everyone to know what to do in an emergency whether they are a parent/carer, a child, an adult wanting more confidence or a professional.

Jen has now been joined on her a mission by a team of 3 other mums who are also qualified first aid trainers, enabling Mini First Aid Sussex to train even more people in potentially lifesaving skills. Last year the team trained over 3,000 people and this year they are aiming for even more.

presented virtually by Dragon's Den investor Sara Davies.

Being part of Mini First Aid enables me to access an incredible amount of training and support as well as having inspirational women in business to look up to like Sara Davies and Mini First Aid founder, Kate Ball. We can't wait to train even more people in first aid this year!"



# Finding comfort in volunteering

"IT'S a sanctuary for me. I just like it there. It gets me out, meeting people, and we have a laugh. I look forward to my afternoon there."

This is how Bob describes the St Wilfrid's Hospice Shop where he volunteers one afternoon each week.

Bob was introduced to the hospice last summer when his wife, Molly, sadly died there.

#### So, so kind

"They were so, so kind," he says.
"There was nothing they wouldn't do
for her, or me. If you're going to die
— and we're all going to die — you
couldn't wish for a better place."

Bob and Molly were married for 58 years, meeting as teenagers and building a life together, first in Beckenham in Kent and later in Alfriston and Seaford.

"Everybody loved Molly," says Bob.
"She was one of those people who lit
up a room. I know it's a cliché but she
did. She was gentle, and she would
smile, and she was always strong."

#### **Good times**

The couple met on a night out in Beckenham, with Bob inviting himself to a party and "spending the whole night just sitting on the stairs with Molly chatting." The pair gelled and it wasn't long before they were married. "We had a very very happy marriage," says Bob. "We had good times, and I miss her terribly."

Molly first became ill in 2019, having an operation to remove a lump in her breast and receiving the all clear. Two years later the cancer was back, initially in her breast and then moving to her liver. "I think then we were both under the impression that she was going to get

better — that it was treatable," continues Bob. 'They sent us away saying "build your strength up so that we can give you chemo," and now that I look back, that was never going to happen.

"And then she became weak — very weak. One afternoon I was sitting at home with her and I said 'Moll we need to get you some help,' so we went to the GP. He was brilliant — he got her into hospital that afternoon. But Molly was deteriorating, and she was referred to the hospice Inpatient Unit.

#### I'll never forget

"They were brilliant — the doctors, the care support workers who used to come in and turn Molly over, and clean her. I spent the last three weeks staying overnight with Molly and, in the middle of the night, they would come in and treat her. And when Molly died, I was with her — with our youngest son James — and I remember the nurse, she just held me. I'll never forget that."

"And now I volunteer in the shop. I walked in there one day — I don't know why — and there was a lady in there who said, 'why don't you come and volunteer here? Lots of us have lost somebody. We're like a family, and you'd be welcome.' And that's where it started. I now volunteer there one afternoon a week, I mend the donated watches, and I make Christmas trees out of driftwood that we sell in the shop."

When asked what his favourite thing about volunteering in the shop is, Bob doesn't hesitate: "The company. I've learned a lot from the other volunteers and have found new hobbies too.




#### **Shop volunteer**

"I would recommend to anybody that you join a shop as a volunteer. You will get more out of it than you will put in. And if you have lost somebody, then a lot of the people there will know what you are going through."

St Wilfrid's Hospice has nine shops in Eastbourne, Seaford, Hailsham, Herstmonceux, Heathfield and Uckfield, all of which raise money to keep hospice services running. Something Bob feels very strongly about: "I know that if the hospice wasn't there for people, it would be much crueller, a much crueller end," he says.

# Meet the DGH dementia care team

THE dementia care teams support people with dementia and those with cognitive impairment or delirium during their hospital stay.

### They offer help and advice to patients, their families and staff on their treatment and care.

Claire Shimmons, a Dementia Care Practitioner, said: "We are here to support anyone with dementia or who has cognitive impairment or delirium. We deal with patients who come in for any reason, such as a fall, and support both them and staff during their stay.

"One of the main ways we can help patients with dementia is the use of the *Butterfly Scheme*. This helps colleagues identify which patients have additional support needs due to a cognitive impairment.

"Any patient can have a discreet butterfly put on the wall by their bed or on their notes. This allows the interaction with the patient to be more tailored to their needs and act as a reminder that they may need an additional explanation of what is going on and help to prepare for what is happening with tests and procedures.

"We also check collateral history with carers and ask if they can complete the 'Reach Out to Me' form which provides information on how we can best support the person while they are here.

"We can be a link between carers and the ward and offer support to carers as it can be a difficult time when a loved-one is in hospital. We can make onward referrals for further carer support if needed."

Patients are also offered activities that support their wellbeing, independence and alleviate boredom while they are away from their normal routine and familiar surroundings.

"We collect magazines for patients so if you have any lying around at home then please bring them in and donate them to us. We also have lots planned for *Dementia Action Week* (May 15th to 21st) so watch this space.

# Treating people with a fraility

#### COMMUNITY frailty team is helping to break the cycle of hospital admissions.

Treating patients so they don't need to come into hospital is just as important as the care they receive while in hospital. The community frailty team, who cover the area from Seaford over to Rye, specialise in treating people over the age of 75 who are living with frailty.

Frailty is a medical condition describing a decrease in physiological reserves which leaves a patient less likely to respond or recover from ordinary events such as a minor illness or even the stress of moving house.

Mark Summerfield is a Frailty
Practitioner based in the community.
"The work we do is to intervene
for patients who are in a cycle
of hospital admissions and reevaluate their care by visiting them
in their home and carrying out an
assessment, face-to-face, often with
family present who can help provide
useful information," says Mark.

"Our intervention can help to break the cycle of hospital admissions, declines in health and reliance on health services. We are looking at what the best outcome for the patient is, but also what their own goals are. Mainly that is to be able to live as independently as they can for as long as possible.

"Frail patients are not generally ill, so we are not trying to fix anything, rather we are adjusting what is already there so that it works better for them and gives control back to them and their family. A good way to do this can be by helping them step down the medical treatment they are currently on.

"After we've assessed them we work to co-ordinate multiple streams of care and preventative care, to help prevent unnecessary procedures and time spent in hospital. We can discuss and review their pathway with their consultant and with the pharmacy team to optimise care, while still being patient-centric and working on their goals."

The team itself has just celebrated its seventh anniversary.





# Green and pleasant

AS bulbs start to fade and herbaceous borders begin to grow in leaps and bounds, it's a clear sign that summer is approaching. With the milder coastal climate, we enjoy here on the south coast, sowing and planting out bedding can begin and you can take softwood cuttings. If you have a lawn, it's also time to get back into the mowing regime, as your lawn will be loving the warmer temperatures this month should bring with it. The weather can sometimes catch us out though, so keep an eye out for, unpredictable changes from mild spells to low temperatures and chilly winds.

All gardening advice has to be adjusted though to consider the weather. Each Spring brings different weather from the previous year. Hopefully we should be frost free by the end of the month, but it is always an idea to have a fleece or cloche handy. With the worldrenowned flower show later this month, May is the time we hear those immortal words, "Chelsea Chop" time. It is great method for stopping some plants getting too big and leggy, and with others, staggering their flowering times.

#### Celebrating the Coronation

This month sees the Coronation of our new King, Charles III. There has been much written about his favourite flowers over the years and which might appear as an integral part of the long weekend celebrations. While we won't know until the day, it is expected that we'll see some of the King's favourite blooms, delphiniums, pictured in header, make an appearance. In the past, the King has been quoted as saying: "For me, the magnificent, gloriously apparelled delphinium, with its impeccable bearing and massed in platoons, holds pride of place in my botanical affections," I suppose it's easy to see why he's such a fan. The plants are extremely popular in cottage-style gardens, they grow in beautiful shades of blue, pink, white and purple, and will add a splash of

colour to your garden border. They are best planted in the springtime in full sun to light shade, with shelter from strong winds. I have to confess to not having much success with them in my own garden, as it is so exposed.

I have been extremely fortunate to meet the new King on two separate occasions, when he was Prince of Wales, back in 2018. The first at a reception for volunteers for Macmillan Cancer Support at Buckingham Palace and later the same year at a Royal Garden party at the Palace. On both occasions he was charming and engaging on talking with him.

#### Preparing Driftwood for opening

This year, my garden will open by arrangement only, between 1st June and 11th August. I'm extremely pleased to be welcoming groups from both the USA and Belgium this summer, along with a special booking, inclusion on a coach tour of "Artist Gardens of Sussex", which includes some of the magnificent Sussex gardens, so we'll be in great company. To date, over 200 visitors have prebooked their visit across the 10 weeks but there is still plenty of opportunity for readers to get in touch and book their visit. This month sees me make the final push to get it all ready for visitors. I'll be collecting over £250 worth of plants, at trade prices, in the next week or so, from a local nursery to plant up and help transform the plot in time for the first day.

There have been major changes since we last opened, with the sunken pond removed and replaced with a corten steel water feature and new patio.

#### **National Garden Scheme**

On 21st May, six gardens open in Seaford for the scheme between midday and 5pm with entry £7. On show, a cottage garden over three levels with ponds, flowers, vegetables and shrubs, a flint walled garden with a coastal and kitchen garden, a plot on different levels with interesting planting and seasonal interest and two mature gardens with a mix of flowers, vegetables and an auricula theatre. The Community Garden provides an interesting space with flower and vegetable beds for members of the community to come together to share their gardening experience.

Over the weekend of the 13th and 14th May, Limekiln Farm in Hailsham opens the garden gate between 2pm and 5pm with entry £7. It was designed in the 1930's when the house was owned by Charles Stewart Taylor, MP for Eastbourne. It has not changed in basic layout since then. The planting aims to reflect the age of the C17 property and original garden design. The house and garden are mentioned in Virginia Woolf's diaries of 1929, depicting a particular charm and peace that still exists today.
