



Bandstand to host Festive Concerts with free tickets

FESTIVE concerts will return to *Eastbourne Bandstand* this Christmas and New Year for the first time since 2019, with free tickets available to book.

Limited seating will be available on the Top Balcony and seats are provided on a first come, first served basis on each of the three days — no ticket required. The *Bandstand's* middle promenade will also be open for people taking a seafront stroll and bars will be open on both the lower and middle levels.

People will not be able to walk through the bandstand on the Lower Prom during the concerts as access will be ticket only.

Boxing Day — Tuesday 26th December — will see The Ray Campbell Band take to the stage from 11:00am—12:30pm. Doors open at 10:30am.





Magical fox





HAILSHAM-BASED renewable energy firm, *OHM Energy* has been crowned Sustainable Business of the Year at the prestigious *Eastbourne Business Awards*.

Sponsored by *Identity*, the Sustainable Business of the Year award looked at how sustainability has been hard-wired into the business, measures taken to reduce the carbon footpint and team attitudes to becoming greener.

The Directors at *OHM Energy* have been in the renewable energy sector since 2000, and are nationally recognised as leading experts in the

industry. They have even been jokingly referred to as the "founding fathers" as they influence the company, the local community and policy by sitting on nationwide working groups and working with government.

Last year, in a joint venture with East Sussex College, OHM Energy launched the first green training hub in Sussex to help bridge the critical skills gap the sector faces. 





league title and four cups in the *East Sussex League*.


The 1996/97 team won the Eastbourne FA Challenge Cup and improved the following season securing the East Sussex League and Cup double.

Eastbourne is ready for a cracker of a Christmas this year with plenty of festive cheer in the bustling town centre thanks to Your Eastbourne BID.

The Eastbourne BID group, which is a business-led, business-funded initiative to improve and enhance Eastbourne town centre, has lit up the town by reinstalling last year's festive lights.

The Victorian Christmas Market will also be returning to the town centre from Thursday December 7–Sunday December 10 (10am–6pm).



Age Concern celebrate

SEVENTY-FIVE years of improving later life for older people in Eastbourne.

By Peter Lindsey

That's the proud achievement of Age Concern Eastbourne, which held a day of celebration to mark the anniversary.

Its other key aim is to avoid people feeling isolated and lonely as they grow old, and to make them socially engaged.

That was certainly the case on Celebration day as around 200 people took part in various activities between 10am and 2pm.

This was followed by a gathering of volunteers and VIPs, including Mayor Candy Vaughan who cut a cake and Deputy Lieutenant of East Sussex Tim Cobb, who planted a memorial cherry tree outside the front of the centre in Junction Road.

Age Concern supports around 600 people and offers more than 40 activities, including belly dancing, art, cafe open to all, hairdressers and other clubs.

Manager John Trainor — who has been with the charity since 2013 — said: "Most of the people who come here are in their 70s but that really does not have to be the case.

"Some are in their 50s, and we offer a very warm and welcoming environment."

Age Concern has 101 volunteers – incredibly it has lost 150 since Covid.

John said: "We do need volunteers, and this can be so rewarding. For some of those we lost, I think they literally got out of the habit, and of course for some there is still concern about Covid, and we have to respect that."

Age Concern has four shops — in Grove Road, Green Street, Langney Shopping Centre and Hampden Park.

It also runs three Sheds — one for arts and crafts in Brassey Avenue, Hampden Park; one in Langney Priory on Etchingham Road; and one on Myrtle Road, Seaside.

John said: "The Sheds are so important to us and we have just secured five years more funding from the *National Lottery*.

"They are places for older people to go but, importantly, to go and actually do something. At Hampden Park's Shed, it's arts and crafts, which attracts more women than men.

"The one at Langney Priory is more about power drills and saws so that naturally attracts more men, as does the one at Myrtle Road, which focuses on making stuff with your hands."

The charity also offers a Homecare service, helping people in their homes. There is a charge and any profit goes back into the charity.

John said: "It's all about social engagement. We are very grateful to the late Patricia Venton, who funded the opening of the building back in 2000.

"We were honoured to welcome the Prince of Wales on the day perform the official opening."

speculation ensued: how did it get there and why. When I returned a week or so later it had gone another unsolved mystery.





from that of a deranged hippopotamus into a champion ballroom performer.




Will they prove everyone wrong and win? Or is Oily destined to have two left feet forever?

My work is inspired by folklore, surrealism and 20th century children's book illustrations. In creating, I seek to make things that are functional, illustrative and playful. Function is important in my work as I like the idea of my pieces being in daily use.

For further inspiration I regularly scout boot fairs and charity shops to find old toys, handmade objects and figurines. My most treasured boot fair find is a small ceramic terracotta giraffe made by a child. Each squish of the clay is visible in its finished form. For me this is what I love most about ceramics and what I look for

when buying them — the mark of the individual in the finished piece.

In my creative practice I generally begin with a piece of clay without quite knowing what it will transform into. Like spotting forms in clouds, something usually emerges from the clay and grows into a more formed idea — often an animal or a creature.

Alongside making, I'm a technician at Eastbourne Studio Pottery and run children's workshops there — it's a great place to mix with and be inspired by fellow creatives. Having grown up in Sussex I feel a deep connection to the area inspired by its rich history of art and local traditions. Green and pleasant

THIS month brings with it the shortest day of the year and you will need to work hard to keep warm outside, maybe some digging or tree pruning. Keep an eye on your winter protection for equipment and plants. If you have a greenhouse, make sure the heater is working as it should. You may not have too many more jobs to do outside, if not you can spend some time with fireside garden planning. Keep an eye on the garden as cold, wet, windy winter weather can damage trees, shrubs and garden structures such as trellis. Seek to improve shelter, staking plants, mulching and wrapping pots to prevent damage.

Not got a Christmas tree yet? Prevent their premature needle drop by choosing a pine or fir tree instead of the traditional Norway spruce. They will hold their needles for longer which is always good news. Once in the house, avoid placing it near sources of heat such as a fire or radiator. A cut tree will last longer if stood in a bucket of water or a stand with a reservoir. You should saw off about 2-3 inches from the base of the trunk to allow the tree to drink freely. I've got a small real tree outdoors, as you can see in the header.

Winter sun

A plant that comes into its own at this time of year is the Mahonia 'Winter Sun'. It is so named for its beautiful yellow flower spikes that rise above the long arching stems with their glossy-green, holly-like leaves through the cold winter months, bringing a ray of sunshine into the winter garden. Not only are the flowers bright and sunny, they are highly fragrant and similar in scent to Lily-of-the-Valley. This mid-sized, hardy evergreen shrub will grow to 4m x 2.5m height and spread and will bring a shady

corner of the garden to life all year round. Mine is planted behind the railway sleepers and is now about 3 metres tall. Tall mahonias that become bare at the base are easily restored by cutting back the stems to about 15cm (6in) from the ground in late winter to early spring.

Whilst most mahonias have sharp spikes on the leaves, you can also buy Mahonia Soft Caress which is the first mahonia of its kind with spine-free leaves, which means it can be planted near to paths or doorways without the fear of being prickled as you might with traditional Mahonia varieties that have holly-like leaves. If you brush past these, there will be no worries about any scratches, opening up many new planting positions and ideas where you may not have considered Mahonia in the past. 'Soft Caress' is also compact and dwarf in nature.

Jobs at Driftwood

I doubt I'll be doing too much in the garden this month, the temperatures have really begun to drop and it's not much fun being out there when it's really cold. I have checked the many large containers of shrubs, that don't like the wind and the cold, under cover in an alley to the side of the house. I've got about several sheltered in there at the moment but they do need to be watered every so often, which has now been done. Regular visits up to the heated greenhouse are needed too, as the plants also need checking. I have one of those probes that you can pierce the soil with and it will tell you how damp it is, allowing you to tell whether it needs watering, it is a really useful

tool at this time of year! Maybe get friends of family to buy you one for Christmas! I regularly check my collection of tender plants too, removing the dead leaves removed and watering where necessary.

Make your own wreath

If you feel inspired, why not raid your garden for some greenery and colour to make your own festive wreath. Buy a moss ring in a local florist and give it a go. I've got both plentiful supplies of holly and ivy growing in the garden as you may have too. Keep some of the lower branches of your Christmas Tree to start the wreath off. You'll need some pieces of wire and if your holly has no berries you can cheat by buying some red berries on wire to add to the finished wreath. Start off by wiring each piece of greenery you plan to use, holly, ivy and tree branches. Next up work your way around the moss circle, carefully securing each piece with the wire to the moss circle by winding the wire around the frame, until it is covered with a mixture of the greenery. Finish off by adding a wire hook if you plan to hang on the door!
