

# Eastbourne residents urged to back fund-raising appeal

A MAJOR new fund-raising appeal will benefit Eastbourne people who urgently need advice and support to help lift them out of poverty.

Eastbourne Foodbank
has launched its first ever
Christmas Appeal and hopes
to raise thousands of pounds
to fund the vital debt advice,
advocacy and welfare support
the charity provides. The "Be
the Life Changer" appeal
began today and will run
throughout December.

### Truly life changing

Chief Executive Jess Holliday said:
"We are not just about food. The
emergency food we distribute can
literally be a life saver for people in
crisis — but the advice and support we
provide is just as important. We work
with people who visit our foodbank to
address the financial challenges they
are facing, lifting them out of poverty.
This work is truly life changing."

With that advice and support, she added, people can be helped so they no longer need to use the foodbank. "Ultimately that's what we're about. We are working for future in which foodbanks don't need to exist, both across the UK and right here in Eastbourne."

Eastbourne Foodbank has had an advice and debt service for some years, and last year its advisors recouped more than £1million for clients. It also runs a Baby Basics service, providing essential support for struggling young families.

While it employs a small team of advisors and has several volunteers to support these areas of work, it wants to raise funds to help more people.

#### Long term solutions

Jess said: "The reality is that many people in Eastbourne need this help and support, which can provide the long term solutions that enable people to stop having to rely on charity to put food on the table.

"People often don't know what support they're entitled to, or really don't know how to go about accessing it. And we see people who have never been in this situation before, never imagined they'd be facing such a crisis: people who are terrified by their mounting debt and really struggle to get to grips with it. Last year we helped more than a thousand people in this way — but, as one of the busiest foodbanks in the UK, we want to be able to do more."

### Be the life changer

The "Be the Life Changer" appeal features the story of just one client. It's based on the experience of real clients, but names and circumstances have been altered to protect confidentiality. It's the story of Mel and her two young children. Mel is grieving for her mum, while also trying to manage debt and keep bailiffs from the door. When Mel visited the foodbank, she not only got support with emergency food and essential items for her baby and toddler, but was met with kindness and warmth, and supported to manage her overwhelming debts.





"Mel is like so many of the people who come to us in crisis. People's problems are often very complex and can easily lead to other issues such as poor mental health, difficulties in getting and holding on to work and your confidence at rock bottom. It becomes a sort of spiral of catastrophe, and people feel hopeless. Tackling these things, especially on your own, is incredibly hard." Jess added.

### Magnificent community

And she is confident the people of Eastbourne will get behind the appeal. "Time and time again we have seen the magnificent way our local community responds to the need in the town. Life is hard for many people but still people care about others — and still they give.

This is a fantastic community and it is thanks to the consistent generosity and compassion from so many, that we're able to do the life changing work we do."

She invited everyone to get involved in this work to change lives. "All donations, no matter how large or small, will help fund this important work, lifting people out of poverty and out of crisis. Every single penny makes a difference. Together, we can begin to turn the tide on poverty, so people in Eastbourne no longer need to use the foodbank. Together, we can change lives."



to our customers and the turbulence of a General Election, our sector has been tremendous.


"Our annual awards encapsulates this, showcasing the superb work from across the industry.

## Finley's Los Angeles dream for 2028

### EASTBOURNE'S Finley Jakes made his Paralympic debut at Paris 2024 – and he's already planning for the 2028 event in Los Angeles.

Finley, 25, took part in the Triathlon — swim, cycle and run — and was seeded to finish 11th. That's exactly what he achieved.

He said: "It was, without doubt, the best experience of my life, to represent my country on the world stage.

"It doesn't get much better than this — the centre of Paris is very special and there were just people everywhere."

Finley is a three-time British champion and his Paralympic debut came after an impressive run of podium finishes on the circuit last year.

He uses a running blade on his right leg, having had an operation at the age of one because his foot had not fully formed.

The swim was first, and it was actually delayed for 24 hours because of poor weather.

'We had a plan and for the plan in the swim was perfectly executed, it went how me and my team wanted it to."

Distance: 750m, Time: 12mins.

Next, cycling, and Finley admits 'it was one of the toughest rides I have ever done'

"Sixty per cent of the course was cobbles and the last couple of laps were particularly tough."

Distance: 20km, Time: 33:28mins

Finley was positioned 12th after both, so finally it was all set for the Run — his strongest of the three. It went well, and a final position of 11th.

Distance: 5km, Time: 18:46mins

"The aim of 2024 was to qualify for Paris, which I achieved, now the target is to be on the winning podium in 2028 at Los Angeles.

"I've only been doing Triathlon for six years, and I was really pleased with my overall performance, very satisfied.

"There were post-game blues — it hit me like a train — but this is what I wanted to do ever since I started athletics in 2012.

"Now, it's more competing until 2028. At the moment, in my category there are five athletes who are out in front. I'm probably in the second group.

"My clear aim in four years time is to be in that top group. I have to be if I want to be on that podium.

"I will probably need to take a couple of seconds off my time in each of the three."

Finley trains seven days a week, having started at *Eastbourne Rovers*, and he says his parents have been amazing with their support.

He started out in athletics having been talent spotted at a *Parasports Day* held by *England Athletics*.

He later added swimming and cycling to his training as he became involved in Para triathlon. His debut season saw him finish third at the British Championships in 2017 before he went one better a year later and won a silver medal.

When Finley made the switch, he had to re-learn how to swim and had to overcome initial fears of falling off the bike to become a medal contender.

In 2021, he was selected for his first major championships at the Europeans in Valencia, where he finished fifth and secured his remarkable maiden win in Alhandra the following month before a top-10 finish at his first World Championships in Abu Dhabi.

Since October 2023, the Eastbourne athlete has secured seven podium finishes in his previous nine events heading into Paris 2024.



## Blue Heart offering free flood resilience surveys

### LOCAL businesses are being offered surveys to help protect against rising flood risks.

Through the project, 40 businesses will receive free Property Flood

Resilience (PFR) Surveys conducted by *JBA Consulting*.

Flooding has become a growing concern for businesses across the region, with the risk of damage and disruption on the rise. Yet, many business owners may not fully understand their specific property's vulnerability or what can be done to reduce it.

### Free survey

The *Blue Heart* project aims to bridge this gap by offering free PFR Surveys that provide businesses with:

Now he has completed the extremely tough challenge he set himself at the start of the year - to run 12 half-marathons and one full marathon in 2024.

In fact, he's done 15 and has raised more than £1,000 for St Wilfrid's Hospice, a place very important to Stu.

He said: "This has ignited a flame in me, and I want to thank everyone who has helped me along the way.

"It has been beautiful way of exploring the Sussex and Kent countryside at some of the events.

"I have a challenging job supporting the homeless across East Sussex, and this has been the perfect escape."

This is his impressive list of achievements

**January** — an unofficial half-marathon from Lewes Railway Station over Mount Caburn and back to Eastbourne.

February - Headcorn Half Marathon in Kent – 'beautiful country lanes and my second half marathon in under two hours."

**March** – Eastbourne Half, Hastings Half and an unofficial one on the Cuckoo Trail – 'for the Eastbourne Half, I fell 200m from the end, my legs gave up, and two strangers picked me up and carried me over

**April** – London Landmarks Half, around the city of London, and one around the Rathfinny Half in Alfriston, it was two laps of the estate.

 ${f May}-{f Birmingham}$  Half as part of the Great Run series, and the UK Ultra half, from Rathfinny to Helen Gardens on Eastbourne Seafront 'then I marshalled afterwards on a busy bank Holiday Saturday in Birling Gap to welcome in the 100milers, 50k runners.'

**June** – Weald Challenge, another trail half organised by Uckfield

Runners. plus an unofficial one which included the Children with Cancer Fund 10k at Polegate.

**July** - Bewl 15 and 5 mile race (Wadhurst Runners) - 'My sister Fiona also took part and it was very special because this was the first time we had done something like this together.'

**August** — a rest (well, sort of). Still running on average 40km each week, three runs and two conditioning sessions - 'that's my weekly routine now still."

**September** – Great North Run - 'it was huge and amazing and my fastest time 1:45:27. My body was used to it by now, what a community atmosphere and huge crowds.' Also in September the Bates Green Gallop which is as many laps of 3.5 miles in six hours as possible at Arlington which was 6 laps equalling 21 miles, and the Wimbledon Half.

October — Beachy Head Marathon 'Mv first marathon. I went too fast for the first two hours but mentally I knew I had to finish, and I did. There was great camaraderie with other runners going through exactly the same experience, I was drained but what a sense of achievement when I crossed the finishing line in 5 hours 28."

So, what next? "I will continue running different races and non races with the wonderful magenta of Run Wednesday including Cross Countries to Marathons. I owe my achievements to everyone at Run Wednesdays and of course my partner Julia."

### Chamber fundraising lunch is highlight in a year's work for UCEP


I took some time to get some feedback from the field staff, teachers and elders on how the scholarship program was delivering on its mission. Their overall opinions were very positive and encouraging. They said that there were marked improvements in the children's school performances and behaviour outside school.

We gave school materials to the children and distributed some bespoke booklets on UCEP's values. They celebrated with a practiced dance for the guests, ending with photographs, some refreshments and farewell songs.

It was a most valuable and moving experience".

CUCKMERE Buses has been operating bus services in the Eastbourne, Hailsham, Cuckmere Valley, Seaford and Lewes area for 48 years.

### Now it needs to recruit more volunteers.

Everybody who runs the organisation and drives its buses are volunteers.

It does not compete with the major operators, and operates in areas where such services are not offered.

The company uses 16-seater minibuses which can negotiate some

of the narrow roads and country lanes in the area.

It has recently taken delivery of a new bus (pictured right) which entered service at the beginning of November after having the company's livery applied to the exterior and being fitted out internally.

It receives no government support for the purchase of its buses.

In 2024 the company is on target to exceed its pre-COVID number of passengers carried (over 81,000).

In addition to running more than 20 services each week, private hire and special services (such as Eastbourne tennis) are operated.

On scheduled services, passengers can pay using concession cards or using cash or credit cards.

In common with major operators, the company has been offering fare paying passengers the nationally subsidised £2 single fare which is due to increase to £3 on 1st January.

The only qualification for volunteer drivers is to hold a current driving licence with a D1 category.

One recent recruit is Toby Philipson, who has answered a number of questions why he wanted to volunteer and his initial experience driving a bus.

Let's hear from Toby:

"I saw *CCB* as an opportunity to give something back to the communities served by *CCB* — to make a difference to those who count upon a regular bus service.

"I had been aware of *CCB* for many years. A neighbour had volunteered for some time and spoke highly of his experiences.

"My grandfather was proud to serve the community of Eastbourne, having driven for Eastbourne Bus Corporation for many years — and so, a combination of factors came together as I reflected upon a recruitment advert I'd seen in a local newspaper. I made contact by e-mail, received a lovely response back and the rest, as they say, is history.

"I work Monday to Friday, so I'm able to support *CCB* at weekends and public holidays. Initially, I wondered whether me working full-time would not be the best option for *CCB*, but that couldn't be further from the truth.


"I can't deny that I wasn't apprehensive when I arrived to meet the trainer, Peter, for the first time, but I needn't have worried. The most important thing for Peter was to settle me into the bus, gauge my competence and, for me, to get a feel for driving the bus.

"With this done, only then, was I introduced to the documentation and process etc, to support the role. This really meant that I was able to make sure that I enjoyed the drive and felt comfortable, before considering the wider aspects of driving for *CCB*.

I had two drives with Peter, perhaps 60 to 90 minutes each, during which, he was encouraging, complimentary and delivered some sound advice! When he suggested that a stop for coffee was an important part of the run out, I knew I was going to be OK! There was absolutely nothing to knock my early experiences with CCB, that's for sure."

Oliver was over the moon and headed straight into *Next*. That's because he had to go to the *Houses of Parliament* the following week for a meeting about *Young Carers Rights*.



# My 60 years addicted to Christmas decorations

FOR over 60 years now, *Bournefree's* gardening guru Geoff Stonebanks has been creating Christmas Magic in his homes.

He has a vast collection that started in the late 1950's and at his Seaford home now curates a collection of more than 40 crates of memorabilia. He also has more than 25 assorted artificial Christmas trees of varying heights.

Once Geoff moved away from home in the 70s, he began buying his own decorations and when his parents retired, he inherited those which had decorated the family pub in Oxfordshire.

Fast forward to 2017 and Geoff decided to try and get some publicity for the large collection and created his own Christmas website (www.geoffschristmas.co.uk).

Little did he know that his trees would end up on page 3 of the *Daily Mail* on December 23rd that year. A journalist from the *Mail* contacted Geoff and arranged to come and shoot his collection for a feature. At the time of the shoot, the trees were dressed across four different rooms.

Once the *Mail's* picture editor saw the images, they asked if all the trees could be moved into one room!

Geoff initially declined, as it was a huge undertaking, until they

offered a large amount of money to complete the task! It was done and a great image was created.

Roll on to 2018 and there were features posted online with both *The Daily Express* and *Mail online*.


By 2020, things began to hot up with Athena Films (a production company commissioned by Channel 5) approaching Geoff to include his collection in an hour-long documentary, along with other collectors, entitled 'Incredible Christmas Trees and How to decorate them.'

Geoff said: "Following the broadcast of the *C5* programme, I was invited to join Holly and Phil, live on *This Morning*, on Wednesday 2nd December.

"Bearing in mind it was Covid year, the coverage was filmed from my iPhone, set up in the house, so sadly not fantastic quality. I gave them a quick tour of the three decorated rooms."

By 2021, Sussex Life decided to publish a two-page feature on the growing collection and C5 repeated the show on December 21st.

Geoff said: "2022 was quite an amazing year too with the German national TV broadcaster, ZDF contacting me in late October and seeking to make a film about getting





the decorations out of store and setting them up around the house.

"They ultimately visited twice, once to film setting the decorations up and again to film the finished rooms. The resulting film aired on their *Mittags Magazine* lunchtime programme in Germany.

"Later in the month, the Jeremy Vine Show on C5 was having a debate about Christmas tinsel and invited me to participate, live from home. The session was filmed again via my iPhone relayed back to the studio.

"The most significant year by far though was last year, 2023, when there was a great deal of interest in talking about my collection. It all began with some great coverage in the *Metro* newspaper quickly followed by a feature online in the Daily Express and an interview on *Heart Radio* with JK and Kelly Brook."

"Amazingly, a Norwegian reporter contacted Geoff too and published a great feature in that country's Dagbladet newspaper.

"ITV's This Morning made another approach, with a view to sending a cameraman to film live. The hosts were Josie Gibson and Craig Doyle. After being filmed across the three decorated rooms, we ended top in the lounge, when the cameraman presented me with a gift from the programme, live on air, of a "This Morning" silver bauble to add to my collection.

2023 was then topped off with an appearance, live from home, on Christmas morning on *Sky News*.

"All in all quite an amazing backstory for my 60 year addiction to Christmas decorations."

# Making a massive difference

IT'S a charity making a massive difference to people across the country – and indeed across the world.

By Peter Lindsey

Medi Tech Trust — situated on the Swan Barn Business Centre at Hailsham — donates medical equipment and unused surgical consumables to where it is most needed.

Apart from medicines, it can be almost anything that is in good condition and can be re-used, including:

- Wheelchairs
- Crutches
- Boots
- Catheters
- Syringes
- Wipes
- Baby consumables, bottles, teats
- Incontinence pads
- Sealed Dressings and bandages.

These are then either shipped abroad to countries in need or donated locally to East Sussex Foodbanks.

Bob Lewis — who set up the charity in 2002 with consultant urologist Graham Watson — said: "We are talking about receiving and then distributing over one million items each year.

"We receive items from a variety of sources. It could be hospitals, medical companies, businesses closing down, other manufacturers who have unwanted items, and equally important, individuals wishing to give back surplus medical equipment or to make a donation.

"We transport and deliver to many developing countries across the world, including 15 countries in Africa, Sri Lanka, and war stricken countries such as Ukraine.

"It's basically giving us medical equipment you no longer need. For example, one donation was of eight Mammogram machines, which we managed to donate to where they would be best used and valued abroad.

"We are a growing charity with five volunteer Trustees, four members of staff, and around twenty volunteers. We value them all greatly. We could do a lot more, but we are stretched to the limits and in desperate need of more volunteers, both in the office and the warehouse. If anyone has a few hours spare on any weekday [Mon–Fri], please call us between 09:00–16:00 on 01323 442211."





Medi Tech Trust also organises Community Projects throughout East Sussex to help others.

One example was a five-year Community Initiative offering GPs their choice of equipment needed that would benefit their patients. This culminated in donating more than 800 items of medical equipment to GP surgeries across East Sussex and Brighton and Hove. Every surgery participated in helping improve services for their patients, which enabled the charity to achieve 100% success. Now some of the surgeries are helping by having recycling bins.

Another initiative is donating first aid kits to various youth sports and social clubs across East Sussex, with ongoing re-fills when needed.

Medi Tech Trust also donated wheelchair ramps to Hailsham Gospel Mission in Station Road and made a significant donation of equipment and consumables worth £50,000 to its mission hospital in Sierra Leone.

Bob said: "There is no doubt the demand is there. What we do is unique

 redistributing surgical consumables to people who need them.

"Our mentoring and training programme is run by Graham Watson and supported by other eminent consultants. This comprises hands on training on site in many African hospitals with online follow up. This programme started in Sri Lanka in 2009. Over the next four years invasive surgery to remove kidney stones was eliminated.

This year's visit, which was predominantly subsidised by *Medi Tech Trust*, included the training of ten local doctors and the carrying out of 40 operations that otherwise would not have been possible. Laser equipment has also been donated so that invasive surgery is no longer needed.

"Medi Tech Trust created a saline water tower system that is used in Africa to make operations safer and quicker, so saving patients the cost of buying saline bags. Many more successful operations now take place as costs are less, safety has improved and infection rates lowered.

"In a way we may be punching above our weight, but we absolutely love what we do — making a difference, a real difference, to people who need it most."

Since its launch, Breast Friends Forever has donated more than £5,000 to Macmillan Cancer Support, Breast Cancer Now as well as St Wilfrid's.

Claire said: "It is about continually giving back, and I am so very proud. Every penny we raise we give back. The group has gone from strength to strength, and that's just fantastic. I feel that we do good and raise money at the same time."

The website provides information and its purpose is to be supportive. There are also blogs, and Claire says it's where you can go to when you need help.

"The charity is very important to me and I want to help as many people as possible. I am now trained in Level 2 Cancer Care so the website can also be seen as a clinic where I can offer support.

"We are planning more charity events moving forward. It has become my world, I am so passionate about it."

The group is hoping to raise money for the new elective hub which will be outside the *DGH* once it is built. There are currently hubs in Brighton and Hastings but not Eastbourne.

Claire says that more men than women actually die of breast cancer, hence her urging people to connect with *Breast Friends Forever*.

"It's all about love and desire – and making a difference."





Town and Eastbourne United.



# Green and pleasant

DECEMBER is generally a quiet month in the garden, but there are probably more things to take care of than you might think. The clocks have now gone back, meaning limited daylight hours and as we fast approach the shortest day of the year, this month's crisp wintery weather can be strikingly beautiful and bitterly cold in equal measure. The Camellia Yuletide in my garden, pictured in the header, still looks good on a frosty morning.

This month you will need some hard work to keep warm outside, such as digging or tree pruning. Remember to check your winter protection and if you have a greenhouse make sure the heater is working. Once your gardening tasks are complete, maybe you will have time for some fireside garden planning.

#### **Driftwood By Sea**

It's hard to believe it's almost Christmas and we are nearly at the end of another gardening year. What an incredible 12 months it has been for *Driftwood* too! In September we marked 20 years of living on the south coast and saw four separate

television films broadcast about the plot, BBC Gardeners' World and BBC SE Today in March, ITV News in April and local station Latest TV in August. Quite remarkable! Then, in late September I was approached by a production company in Bristol to use the garden for some paid location filming for a new programme on C4 being broadcast early next year. It was hard to get it looking good for filming in mid-October but we were extremely lucky with a beautiful sunny day which really helped. As part of the new programme format, the team planned to visit beautiful and unique gardens where they gather inspiration to incorporate into the chosen garden designs for the homeowners

involved in the project. The team said that through their research they had found *Driftwood* and thought it would be perfect inspiration for a seaside garden that is being designed. Watch this space! There is a 2-page feature on *Driftwood* in the December issue of the national gardening magazine, *Modern Gardens*. It's almost four years now that I have been writing this monthly gardening feature in *Bournefree* too, how time flies.

#### Christmas is coming

When I think of Christmas and the garden, for me the top two things that come to mind are holly and ivy. They are two of the very traditional and stereotypical decorations for this time of year. So, if you have any growing on your plot, why not gather some and hang around your doorways and window frames to really give your house the traditional Christmas look this year. I remember, way back in my childhood in the 1960's, my parents had a pub in Oxfordshire and I would decorate it for Christmas with sprigs of holly and ivy cut from the garden plus some mistletoe we'd be given. I'd sometimes spray the foliage in gold and silver and use the mix to intertwine around the bar canopy or behind the pictures on the wall. You can also add small glass baubles or other Christmas decorations from them to create a great natural look in the house. They are both perfect for some Christmas inspiration from the garden. I have a few berries on my holly bushes this year and they look so pretty, it almost seems a shame to cut the sprigs off.

You can also cut branches from conifers or fir trees in the garden to create that naturalistic look too. If you have any seed heads or faded hydrangea flowers from the garden, these too, can be sprayed gold and silver, to add to the more conventional Christmas decorations.

#### Will we get snow?

I love sculpture in the garden all year around but in the Winter, with a bit of frost or maybe a fall of snow, it can transform the garden into a mini magical kingdom. Most of my pieces are rusty metal which really catch the snow as it falls or a range of wooden wheels, not to mention a few garden gnomes too! Other pieces are metal spheres and cone plant supports which all look equally as impressive. Even if it there's no snow this Christmas, it doesn't need to stop you having your very own snowman. I recently saw one made out of a series of different diameter terracotta plant pots, each turned upside down, one on the other, and then painted white with a cute face and decorated with a scarf. It is also a great way to make use of any excess garden pots. This could be the perfect chance to engage any younger members of the family to enter into the festive spirit and to be creative in the garden.


