"During 2025, we will publicise events and news about the charity. We also hope to stage events, and it would be great for the wider *Bournefree* family to be involved.

Simon Cosham, General Manager at You Raise Me Up said: "You Raise Me Up was founded by the late Jane Brooks and her husband Fraser in June 2011. The charity's sole purpose is to raise funds to assist families that have suffered the loss of a young person aged 16–25 years.

"We are based in Polegate and look after families from Sussex and Kent

providing compassion, support and being able to say, 'we totally understand' rather than 'we cannot imagine what you are going through'.

## Feeling less alone

"We have experienced counsellors to assist families and also run monthly groups, where families can come together and feel less alone.

"The mental health impact of the death of a child on surviving family members is huge and *YRMU* supports them to survive that and stabilise their mental wellbeing. This enables them to function again in everyday life and support their lives going forward.

Grief is a lonely journey and making friends with others who have that shared experience and support each other is vital.

"You Raise Me Up have now supported over 550 families and we do not receive ANY government funding. Our support is only possible through the generosity of individuals, groups and businesses both financially and gifts in kind.

"We are delighted to be nominated as Bournefree magazine's Charity of The Year for 2025 and look forward to a successful and mutually beneficial partnership in the coming year. # Final round of Blue Heart Community Fund Grants

THE Blue Heart Community Fund is offering its final round of grant funding to help individuals, community groups, and organisations in Eastbourne and southern Wealden tackle the challenges of climate change and flooding.

Applications for the *Community Fund* open on January 6th, 2025, and close on February 24th, 2025.

Grants are available to support projects that:

- Manage flooding or drought.
- Reduce the impacts of climate change.
- Protect and share the natural environment.
- Inform and engage people about these issues.

The fund also supports activities that build community resilience, helping people to become more aware, prepared, organized, and connected in response to emergencies like flooding.

Funding is available as:

- Small Grants (up to £500) to test new ideas or pilot projects.
- Large Grants (up to £5,000) for scaling up or expanding successful initiatives.

The Blue Heart Project is funded by DEFRA's £200m FCRIP. As such, projects must take place in Eastbourne or southern Wealden and align with the fund's priorities. Applications can be made online or by downloading a form at www.blueheart.org.uk/blue-heart-community-fund

## Raystede launches appeal

RAYSTEDE Centre for Animal Welfare has launched an urgent appeal to help keep its animals warm and safe this winter.

With high energy costs and a record number of requests to take in animals, the charity is determined to ensure no animal is left out in the cold.

Faced with what it describes as a "perfect storm," *Raystede* is grappling with high heating expenses, surging animal intake, and fewer adoptions, all against the backdrop of the ongoing cost-of-living crisis.

Heating and lighting alone costs the charity £360 every single day and the charity's spend on essential veterinary medicines has increased by 66% on the same period last year.

Entirely reliant on public donations, Raystede must raise £2.5 million annually to continue its vital work.

Last year, Raystede had an unprecedented 4,278 requests to take animals into its care, with many of the animals it was able to help arriving in need of medical treatment and rehabilitation. Yet, the rising financial strain on households has also slowed adoptions, leaving more animals in its care for longer.

Winter is often a season that brings unexpected costs too, for example the recent high winds caused by Storm Darragh completely flattened one of *Raystede's* equine field



shelters. The cost to replace the shelter ensuring their resident ponies and horses can stay warm and dry will cost the charity around £3,500.

Stephanie Smith, Chief Executive of *Raystede*, explained: "Many of the animals we care for have suffered neglect, abuse or abandonment. It's our mission to provide them with warmth, safety and hope, but we can't do it alone.

"Rising costs are affecting us all, but the situation at *Raystede* remains challenging. Our energy bills are huge and the cost of veterinary medicine is now significant, particularly as we're taking in more animals with behavioural and medical needs as well as those that require longer ongoing care.

"Every pound donated helps us protect vulnerable animals, from elderly dogs and cats to rescued rabbits, goats, donkeys and horses."

Some 2,021 households and businesses have now switched, which equates to 31% of the connectable premises, or 27% of the total area.

The area went live in August 2021 and was completed in January 2023.

Lightning Fibre provides a full fibre connection to the Old Town Community Library (OTCL), which is free of charge during 2025 as part of the company's community engagement and support.



## Invaluable service

Kate Daly, OTCL secretary, said: "We are delighted with the service both at home and at Old Town Community Library. There are rarely any issues and if there are, they are quickly resolved. The service is invaluable to the library customers, many of whom use the internet and laptops for job searches and homework."

The award-winning Old Town Community Library, Eastbourne, is a charity library entirely run and led by volunteers.

The library offers books, free internet, laptops, printing, a superb selection of adult fiction, a small non-fiction area, large print, audiobooks and a lovely children's area.

Founded in 2028, with an HQ in Polegate, and a customer service team and retail unit based in Eastbourne, Lightning Fibre is the local network for Eastbourne. The company supports a range of local events and good causes, including Eastbourne Carnival and the Lightning Fibre Ice Rink.

They also give talks on birds, nature and the *RSPB* to community groups in the local area.





DID you know *Komedia* in Brighton started out at a smaller venue in Manchester Street, Kemptown, in 1994?



The top four finalists (not all printers) were sent a mystery shopper to see if their customer service claims lived up to expectation. *Prints Regent* won the coveted prize. Credit went to patient driving service *Driving Miss Daisy*, who were Highly Commended runners-up.

Prints Regent have many glowing reviews on their website. Delighted clients comment on the great quality of their printing, speedy service, friendly and helpful manner.

In order to meet a recent deadline, owner Michael Hopkins drove the 104 miles one Sunday morning to deliver an order to Henley-on-Thames. I'm told there are also similar regular weekend trips to Kent and London.

Working late or delivering outside office hours, it seems nothing is too much trouble. Every job is equally welcome, regardless of size or print run. It's an unrivalled service you are unlikely to receive from an online printer, although ironically, that's how *Prints Regent* started out...

## 40 years' experience

Prints Regent is the second printing business from Michael, a former student at the London College of Printing. The first business, founded in 2003, was at the forefront of the digital printing revolution, and provided a trade service to other printing companies across the UK.

During this time, Michael was the only Adobe Authorised Print Service Provider in Kent. He designed the programmes for Welling United FC which went on to win Programme Of The Year from The Football Association due to some imaginative thinking.

At the time the business was sold to another printer, 90% of their clients were printers or design agencies. To satisfy the needs of such, quality and service were paramount.

Years later, *Prints Regent* was formed as a print management company near Dartford, buying and selling print on behalf of its clients. Through the previous business as a supplier, Michael had established a network of printers across the country who could now supply him. Sadly, the service provided in return was not as reliable.

Through necessity, *Prints Regent* began investing in its own equipment to ensure that deadlines and their exemplary standards were maintained.

Michael moved to Eastbourne in 2015 and the business followed in 2021, opposite ESK in Courtlands Road, where they have continued to expand their product range to include clothing, merchandise, websites, signage and display. A one-stop shop.

Their website contains only a sample of the work they can produce. If you can't see the item you need, just give them a call, or pay them a visit. No appointment is necessary and a warm welcome awaits.

# Jonathan Webley – 30 years of devotion

JONATHAN Webley won a Lifetime Achievement Award at the Eastbourne Business Awards. He was the General Manager at the five-star Grand Hotel for 30 years.

When Jonathan started his career as a trainee back in 1981, little did he think that he would serve 30 years as the General Manager.

Well, he did, hosting celebrities including Paul McCartney, George Michael and Freddie Mercury along the way — but now he's retired after a five-star career.

## A very proud moment

He said: "It was a lovely surprise to receive this accolade at the *Eastbourne Business Awards*. I had been invited but didn't dream that I would be up on stage as a winner. It was a very proud moment indeed."

The career, having started in 1981, saw Jonathan progress to Assistant Manager at the *Grand* in 1983, then a short spell as Deputy Manager at the *Cavendish Hotel*. At the time, both were owned by *De Vere Hotels*.

Back to the *Grand* as Assistant Manager and then Deputy Manager before an 18-month spell in 1993 working in Coventry.

With a young family, it was time to come back to Eastbourne as

General Manager of the *Grand* from 1994.

## **Fantastic time**

Jonathan remembers: "Back in 1994, the *Grand Hotel* had become quite tired but it was bought by *Elite Hotels* in 1998, who carried out an ambitious plan which included a very sympathetic refurbishment.

"It was a fantastic time — I recall that we did not close during the refurb but in effect it was a new hotel, with its 152 rooms.

"From then on, it was a story of steady growth year on year. We saw a slight dip in conferences and then came the pandemic, which was pretty devastating.

"When everything reopened, our trade quickly returned — lobsters and steaks were flying out of kitchens as guests spoiled themselves after having been cooped up.

## Building a successful team

"For me, the highlight was building a successful team from within – 85 percent of our senior staff were homegrown, and with that came the culture and loyalty.





"We also maintained our five-star rating, which is never easy."

Jonathan remembers the *Grand Hotel* fire in 1995 which affected 60 rooms — 10 were gutted.

He also said events such as the Tennis and *Airbourne* were – and still are – vital for the local economy.

And for the future?

"We love Eastbourne, and we be staying in Eastbourne,' he said.







# Green and pleasant

AS we start the new year, January is often regarded as the coldest month and it might be the middle of winter, but the days will start to lengthen and your garden will start to grow. Why not take time to plan for the coming gardening year ahead, maybe order seeds and new plants. There's bound to be some dry sunny days to enjoy the fresh air too. Remember to check your winter protection, ensure stakes, ties and supports are still working after any severe weather.

Maybe put out food for the birds and perhaps leave some garden areas uncut for a little longer, to provide shelter for wildlife in your garden. January is a time for fresh starts, renewed energy, and grand plans for the twelve months ahead. That said, it can be really difficult out there, due to the cold and the ground being so hard.

### New Year's resolutions

Have you made any resolutions for the coming year? A fun idea for your garden might be to take a photograph from the same point, on the same date in each of the 12 months of the year! Maybe using several points of interest. This is

something I've done over the years and it is quite surprising to look back at the collection and actually see the changes, across both the months and the seasons of the year!

Another idea might be to create a different look in your garden this season. Perhaps try moving containerised shrubs around to different locations. You will be quite surprised how easy it can be to make your plot look a little different each year! If you have pieces of sculpture in the garden these can be relocated too.

Why not decide to list all the plants you buy so that you don't forget what you've got! If, like me, you open your garden, it is inevitable that visitors ask what certain plants are and it can be embarrassing if you don't know. In recent years, I have logged them all down so that I can recall their names if asked. It's a good idea, even if you don't open your plot as friends and family may ask! 




### **RAIL ENGINEERING** STUDENTS BENEFIT FROM DEDICATED TRAINING TRACK.


