



### Magic buses

CUCKMERE Buses operate a modern fleet of 16-seater minibuses all driven by volunteers.

Over 20 scheduled services are operated each week in the local area. Private hires can also be driven.

Our summer timetable will include the following:

 A new Service 24 running every Tuesday and Thursday between Eastbourne and Drusillas Zoo Park. This means that Drusillas will be served four days each week with Service 25 calling on Saturdays and Service 26 on Sundays. **Service 39** operates every Friday, Saturday and Sunday from the *Towner Gallery*, and now also from Gildredge Road to Alfriston, *Charleston House* Firle and Charleston Lewes. This service is partly funded by the *Charleston Trust*.

• Service 47 (the Rambler) is an hourly circular service starting at Berwick Station and calling at Drusillas, Alfriston, Seaford, then returning to Berwick via Seven Sisters Country Park, Litlington and Wilmington. A single ticket on this service can allow passengers to hop on and hop off at the various tourist attractions and pubs on the route.

## All change for local growers

NEW research reveals how local growers are adapting to a changing climate.

Carried out by the Eastbourne
Eco Action Network (EEAN) and
supported by the Blue Heart
Community Fund, the survey
received responses from 60
local growers across East Sussex.

#### Insects have won the battle

The findings show that many have experienced significant weather changes over the past five years.

78% reported more intense rainfall, with others noting stronger winds, fewer cold snaps, and an increase in pests. One grower remarked that "the insects have won the battle this year," linking the rise in pests to the lack of frost.

In response, growers are innovating. Some are experimenting with crops that wouldn't have survived locally in the past, while others are investing in rainwater storage, switching to drought-tolerant plants, or trying out new cultivation methods.



#### **Drought resistant plants**

One participant shared, "I took up my concrete front garden and replaced it with membrane, gravel and droughtresistant plants like lavender."

Encouragingly, the research also highlights a strong appetite for collaboration. Many growers expressed interest in sharing knowledge, exploring sustainable methods, and improving local food security.

#### Support

**EEAN** and Blue Heart will continue supporting local growers through workshops, research, and funding opportunities.

## Sign up for the Lighthouse Challenge

IT'S almost that time of year again – the *Rotary Club of Eastbourne AM's Lighthouse Challenge* fundraising walk.

And this year it's much earlier in the year — the date is Sunday May 25th at 3pm.

Here's Martin Wellings, one of the organisers: "For those who have not completed the Challenge before, it essentially involves a marshalled walk to and around the *Beachy Head Lighthouse*.

"We ask for a modest entry fee which is donated to local charities.

"This is only possible on certain days of the year and has proved very popular, with usually in excess of 1,000 walkers taking part, each receiving a commemorative certificate at the end."

The arrival point is at the kiosk at the foot of the Downs by Bedes school in Eastbourne. On arrival, participants proceed up the lane



for approximately half a mile to Whitbread Hollow where you will find the check-in desks.

Once checked-in, you set off across the Downs to Cow Gap (approx. 15 minutes), down the steps to the beach and over the rocks, boulders, sand and slippery seaweed to the lighthouse (average 60 minutes).

To take part, you need to be reasonably fit for a mixture of walking and clambering. Some of the rocks

around the lighthouse are quite large and, due to seaweed, parts of the route can also be very slippery — the going gets more difficult the nearer to the lighthouse you get!

There is an entry fee of £10 for adults and £5 for under 16s. Profits made go to local charities while part of the funds raised are set aside towards the next re-paint of the lighthouse.







## Jamie Oliver's hot cross buns

Have a pukka Easter with these brilliant buns.

By Harriet Smallholder

#### **METHOD**

- **1.** Add the milk and 50ml water to a small pan and place over a low heat for a few minutes.
- 2. Add the butter to a separate pan and place over a low heat for a few minutes, or until melted, then set aside.
- **3.** Transfer the warmed milk mixture to a medium bowl and stir in the yeast.
- **4.** Sift the flour into a large bowl, then add 1 teaspoon of sea salt, the spices, a few good scrapings of nutmeg and the sugar. Finely chop the stem ginger and stir it into the mix.
- **5.** Make a well in the centre and pour in the melted butter, followed by the yeast mixture. In a separate bowl, beat the egg and add it to the bowl.
- 6. Using a fork, mix well until you have a rough dough, then transfer to a clean flour dusted work surface and knead for around 10 minutes, or until soft and springy.
- 7. Return the dough to a flour-dusted bowl, cover with a damp tea towel and leave to prove in a warm place for at least an hour, or until doubled in size.
- **8.** Transfer the dough to a clean flour dusted work surface. Knock the air out by bashing it with your fist, then sprinkle over the dried fruit and mixed peel and knead into the dough.
- **9.** Preheat the oven to 190°C, then grease and line a large baking tray.

- **10.** Divide the dough into 12 equal pieces and roll each into a ball, evenly spacing them out on the tray as you go. Cover with the tea towel and leave in a warm place for a further 30 minutes, or until doubled in size.
- 11. Place the plain flour and 2 tablespoons of water into a small bowl and mix to a thick paste. Pat down the risen buns then use the batter to trace a cross over the top with a piping bag or spoon.
- **12.** Place the buns into the preheated oven for 15-20mins, or until golden brown. Transfer to a wire cooling rack, brush over a little honey to glaze, then leave to cool.







The drinks arrive and my daughter has the Mango Chilli Margarita. A hint of sweetness, with compliments of spicy chilli and lime to cut through it all.

A great start to Spring. I enjoyed an elegant, crisp Gavi. I must say the wine list is expertly curated, and sensibly priced.

For the greedy, like us, there's bread before the starters, warm, fresh and soft, with butter and olive oil!

#### All change

"People don't want cameras any more as they use their phones. Of course it is sad but I am still working and this presents a new challenge for me. In many ways, I will probably be working harder than ever."

Hailsham Active are able to fund (with help/sponsorship from Lightning Fibre) a grants specialist.

The grants specialist, Annette Buswell, is also a director of Hailsham Active and gives a great deal of her own time, free of charge, to many of our projects.

As an example, the lighting at Western Road recreation ground cost just over £60,000. Through Annettes skills, we were able to fund £50,000

of the project with Hailsham Town Council providing most of the balance through its CIL funds.

Even greater sums of money were found for Horam (try their new 'agriflex' footpath, runners love it, but so do mums and dads teaching their children to cycle, skate and scoot!).

So with Annette as a key part of the project team, we are working out what can be done in terms of what the community really needs (not just the sports club).

The project is well under way with the design stage almost complete and



we are now looking at how we can implement the changes during the next few years.

What is so pleasing is it shows quite clearly when everyone is onboard, we can create a wonderful facility form many years to come and probably with sports we hadn't even though of.

There is a similar approach at Herstmonceux, where again, crucially, the *Parish Council* is actively engaged with the sports clubs and local community. Indeed opportunities exist to incorporate the local primary school with a path around the recreation ground linking directly to the school.



When I meet up with the sports clubs and parish councils, the sense of community is overwhelmingly positive and it is something we try to demonstrate to *Wealden District Council*. With a positive attitude, they could release a goldmine of talent across the area (not just Hailsham).

NEW research suggests up to 40% of dementia cases could be avoided, so what can you do to protect your brain?


If people are more your thing, ensure you have a harmonious relationship, and never underestimate the importance of laughter, which releases dopamine and serotonin, essential for brain health.

Daily puzzles, board games, or learning a new language can significantly bolster cognitive function in the stimulation of synaptic connections, while activities like gardening or dancing increase levels of brain-derived neurotrophic factor (BDNF), which promotes the growth of new neurons.

Starting the day with a protein-rich breakfast stabilises blood sugar levels, while reducing refined carbs can lower the risk of cognitive decline linked to metabolic health. Also consider taking a vitamin D supplement, which may help prevent dementia.

Finally, good sleep — total darkness, peace and quiet — allows the brain to clear toxins, aiding recovery and reducing cognitive decline. Your brain will thank you.





The woods are often filled with the sound of birdsona but often it is frustratingly difficult to see the birds and, if you do manage to find the songster, it will probably just look small and brown! But even without birds the woods can be quite loud with the wind rustling through the leaves and the trees creaking as they are blown about. You may also hear a sudden sound in the undergrowth when a deer is spooked, but so often it disappears before you have seen it properly.

Hedgerows are home to singing robins, tits and buzzing bees and if you are lucky, you might hear the noise of bull frogs croaking in nearby ditches.

High in the sky can be heard the distinctive sound of buzzards or red kites with their very distinctive calls and skylarks are always a joy to hear up on the Downs. In spring, you can often hear lambs and ewes calling loudly to each other, especially when a lamb realises that it is hungry and can't see its mother.

If you walk along the seafront there is always the sound of the sea in all her moods — the calm of the tide rattling the stones as the waves go back and forth, or the fury of a wild sea crashing against the sea wall or groynes which can be quite exhilarating. A walk along



the Cuckmere or Ouse has a very different atmosphere without the extremes of mood.



# Sting in the tail

IS there something in the air of East Sussex that inspires would-be novelists? Local writer Colin Bostock-Smith thinks there might be.

"Since I was 17, back in the Sixties, I have been attempting to write a full-length novel that would be published by a reputable publisher," he says. "Now at last, and finally living in the depths of Sussex, I've made it."

The book in question is *Sting of the Nettle*, the publisher is *Diamond Crime Books*, and it's available right now, via book shops and of course, *Amazon*.

### Successful career

Despite being a struggling novelist for most of his life, Colin achieved a long and successful career as a television comedy writer. He contributed widely to the Two Ronnies, Not the Nine O'clock News, the Russ Abbot Madhouse and the Clive James Show, the latter as a two-man writing partnership with the great Australian star. He also wrote for such widely diverse characters as the Krankies, President Ronald Reagan, and Basil Brush.

### **Changing tastes**

His play "You Must Be the Husband", based on his situation comedy of the same name, toured Britain three times, and was translated into German and Italian.

"But, Colin says, "tastes in comedy changed with the new millennium, and I retired to Sussex, found the atmosphere inducive to writing, and sat down to produce *Sting of the Nettle.*"

#### Unusual hero

The novel is set in an unusual time, an unusual place, with an unusual hero. The time is early fifties, when the shade of World War still hangs over the country. The place is West Devon, apparently a rural backwater but as we learn, also a place of exotic and criminal happenings. The hero is a young village constable named Derek Martin who has a ferret-like determination to get to the bottom of things, to the root of trouble. Which lands him in extreme danger.

# Green and pleasant

APRIL'S here and spring has sprung at last! As the weather warms up and early flowers start to bloom, all of a sudden there's a load of jobs to do outside. This month, there's plenty to sow and grow in your garden and greenhouse. But there's lots more to do besides sowing and planting out, especially in my eclectic garden. Tulips pictured in the header looking good at Driftwood this month too.

This month provides us with many of our favourite spring flowers to enjoy but the weather can be unpredictable. We can have anything from a heatwave to ground frosts and sleet, so be prepared. The best protection for tender bedding plants, if frost strikes, are cloches or a horticultural fleece. On the other hand, warmer days can see slugs and snails making an appearance and leaving their mark. They view the young shoots of Delphiniums, Hostas, lettuce and the like as the equivalent of caviar, so make sure you protect any new growth you see.

### Caring for Hellebores

I have some magnificent hellebores in my beach garden which are starting to fade. Depending on how they look, April is a good time to cut down their stems. The new growth can be seen at the base of the plant and care is needed to ensure this is not snipped instead. I have the taller hellebore, argutifolius or the Corsican hellebore and it is prone to flop all over the place. It is hard to stake, so best chopped, taking off the flower and stalks down to the ground although the other types Hellebores can be left alone.

### The National Garden Scheme

There are several plots open for the scheme this month across the county but here are three of them you may like to visit. First up, *The Garden House* at 5 Warleigh Road in Brighton, opening on Friday 11th and Sunday 13th from 1pm to 5pm with entrance £6. This is one of Brighton's secret gardens aiming to provide year-round interest with trees, shrubs, herbaceous borders and annuals, fruit and vegetables. It's a friendly garden, with a touch of magic to delight visitors, above all it is a slice of the country in the midst of a bustling city. Plants for sale too.

Over now in Lewes there is *Banks Farm* in Boast Lane, Barcombe, opening both days over the weekend of 26th and 27th from 11am to 4pm with entry £5. This 9 acre garden is set in rural countryside with extensive lawns and shrub beds which merge with the more naturalistic woodland garden set around the lake. An orchard, vegetable garden, ponds and a wide variety of plant species add to an interesting and very tranquil garden.

The third is *The Oast* in Fletching Street, Mayfield also open both days of the same weekend from 11am to 5pm with entry £5. Wander through a 1 acre garden in an idyllic High Weald setting with a beautiful view. There is year-round interest, with highlights in spring. This month there should be over 4000 tulips and other spring bulbs bloom. Enjoy the woodland-edge walk, wildlife pond, vegetables and soft fruit, along with quality homegrown plants for sale. All last approximately 1 hour and my fee is £105 plus expenses.

#### **Feeding regime**

I'll be starting my feeding regime to ensure all the plants and shrubs look their very best for my Summer visitors. I feed everything! I have a large collection of shrubs which provide a variety of fragrant flowers, berries, autumn colour, foliage and coloured stems. In addition, they add shape and a basic structural framework to my garden and provide shelter and a great food source for wildlife. No matter what, they are, they all get fed throughout the season. The results I get from feeding every year are amazing. The product is soluble and I water by hand, with a watering can, a task that can take a few hours, in stages! You don't have to be so meticulous as me but feeding will help get the best from your plants.
