


Make more of your free time and volunteer with Eastbourne Sea Cadets

The panel for the evening is...


 The editor of Bournefree Peter Lindsey, journalist, referee, and chairman of the Sussex County FA Referees Working Group.

Award for flourishing community allotment

A DEDICATED community leader whose passion inspires a large team of volunteers to grow fruit and veg at an Eastbourne allotment has won a prestigious national award.

Sally Lee, of Rooted Community Food, has won the Royal Horticultural Society's Carew Pole Community Award.

She co-ordinates up to 30 volunteers on the Gorringe Road allotment who grow food to supply community fridges and homeless charities.

There is a growing plot and a separate plot with an outdoor kitchen,

kitchen garden and a large shelter for cook-ups and creative sessions.

The award submission by *Rooted* volunteers Liz Magraw, Caoimhe McDonne and Liz Purkis stated: "Sally has demonstrated outstanding qualities in developing a welcoming and inclusive community at *Rooted*.

"Volunteers come from all walks of life, including different nationalities and languages, refugees, people with disabilities and medical conditions, and those seeking a safe haven.
"The team have become confident

growers, learning through successes and failures, and expanding their knowledge and range of crops, including melons this year."

Rooted also gathers excess produce from other allotment growers via a 'Crop Drop' which it delivers to good causes. This year, it is aiming to donate four tonnes.

The RHS Carew Pole Community Award is awarded for an outstanding contribution to a community gardening programme which brings value to the wider community.


Members are volunteers-trained and dispatched by the South East Coast Ambulance Service to provide a First Response to 999 emergency calls.

Fungal nail infections, also known as onychomycosis, are a common, often frustrating problem that affects millions of people worldwide. In this Article, we will break down what fungal nail infections are, how to recognise them, what causes them and the best ways to treat and prevent them.

What are fungal nail infections?

Fungal nail infections occur when fungi, most commonly dermatophytes, invade the nail bed,plate or surrounding skin. These microscopic organisms thrive in warm, moist, damp environments so its no surprise that our feet are particularly Vulnerable! Another factor is work, whether you work on a building site or work from home you are at risk of developing fungal nails. When working from home people get comfortable with their slippers on and this gets nice and toasty which is great from a comfort point of view: but also lovely for the microorganism that are loving living on your skin!

Some things we can't change which we call non-environmental variables. These include diabetes, immune

How do we plan our walks?

I'M often asked how walk leaders plan their walks. Walk leaders will, of course, have their own preferred method but I usually start by letting someone else do the work!

This may involve browsing through a book of walks (of which I have many) or a walking magazine, a web site, or a leaflet I have picked up from somewhere.

Then I need to check the mileage on an ordnance survey map and amend the route if necessary to meet the mileage requirement as well as thinking about where to park and where suitable lunch and coffee stops might be.

Next we head off to try it out. This is where it gets interesting when paths that are so obvious on a map then prove difficult or impossible to find on the ground and you wish you'd bought the secateurs to hack your way through the undergrowth. I should own up here and say that it isn't always the fault of the terrain — it is all too easy to miss a path when chatting and not looking at the map often enough. In both cases a 10 mile recce can often turn into 14 or more as we try to get back on track!

Other leaders decide they want to walk in a particular area, look at the map and work out their own route from the marked footpaths. They then meet the same problem described above!

A third method relies on a piece of string! Imagine a piece of string 10 miles long and knotted to make a circle. Apparently you then just drop it on a map and make it fit the footpaths! But you still have to recce and overcome the challenges of impenetrable paths and too much chatting!

If you don't fancy playing with maps but prefer technology then you could try using the *Ordnance Survey* app to plan, plot, recce and lead walks. A basic version of this is free to use or a much more sophisticated one is available on subscription — worth every penny if you are a regular rambler.

If you haven't tried one of our new Saturday walks yet, why not come and Explore *Abbott's Wood* with us on May 17th. This is a 7 mile walk starting at 9:30am which hopefully will catch the end of the bluebells – details on our website:







Perhaps begin to tidy and cut back your spring plants, planting out flowers and vegetables for summer and maybe preparing for autumn, sowing seeds and planting out chrysanthemums. The weather can sometimes catch us out though, so keep an eye out for, unpredictable changes from mild spells to low temperatures and chilly winds.

All gardening advice has to be adjusted though to consider the weather. Each Spring brings different weather from the previous year. Hopefully we should be frost free by the end of the month, but it is always an idea to have a fleece or cloche handy. With the world-renowned flower show later this month, May is the time we hear those immortal words, "Chelsea Chop" time. It is great method for stopping some plants getting too big and leggy, and with others, staggering their flowering times.

Driftwood opening 2025

2025 has been quite challenging so far. As you read this, I will be recovering from replacement knee

surgery. It's going to be frustrating in the coming weeks not being able to do what I want out in the garden. I worked very hard, up to being admitted into hospital, to get the garden as ready as I could. Driftwood is open, by arrangement only, from 1st June through until the 3rd August! That said, I would encourage visitors to book from mid-June onwards, as my expected 6-week recovery concludes then and hopefully I will be a little more mobile. I hope to have some trusty help on hand if I am still in difficulty. Email visitdriftwood@gmail.com to arrange a summer visit.

National Garden Scheme

There are a couple of brand-new gardens opening for the scheme this month. First up is *Kotamki* in Tottingworth Park, Broad Oak, near Heathfield on Saturday 17th May from 10am to midday with entry

£12 and children £6. Pre-booking is essential, at **www.ngs.org.uk** A talk by the owners about the garden will take place at 10:30am. This is a large creatively planted garden featuring a long double border within yew hedging, rockery, shade garden, exotic garden, pot garden, wildflower meadows, and kitchen garden. There is an emphasis on continuity of interest via imaginative mixed plantings.

Secondly, we have *The White House* in Redbridge Lane, Crowborough opening both days on the weekend of the 17th and 18th May from 11am to 4pm with entry £6. Sitting high on a hill with 180-degree panoramic views, overlooking the downs for 25 miles in an area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The main garden has been redesigned to incorporate the borrowed landscape with herbaceous borders in a cottage garden style and see the moongates in the walled kitchen garden.

96 Ashford Road in Hastings opens on 3 Saturdays in May, 10th, 17th and 24th from 1pm to 4:30pm with entry £4. This is a small (100ft x 52ft) Japanese inspired front and back garden which is full of interesting planting with many acers, azaleas and bamboos. See over 100 different hostas, many miniature ones. Don't miss the attractive Japanese Tea House and courtyard with fish pond and the new Japanese bridge and pond in the lower garden too.

Chelsea Chop

Most gardeners will have heard the phrase, the Chelsea Chop, but what is it and what does it mean? It's a pruning technique used at this time of the year which helps to control and limit the size and flowering season of many herbaceous plants. According to the *RHS*, there are three suggestions

or methods to ensure the Chelsea chop is effective. Which method you choose will depend on the type of plant, how big your plant clump is and the effect you want to achieve.

- a) Clumps of perennials can be literally be chopped back by one third to a half, using shears or secateurs. This will delay the flowering until later in the summer and keep plants shorter and more compact.
- b) If you have several clumps of one plant, try cutting back some of them, but leaving others. This will prolong the overall flowering time as some will flower early and the others later.
- c) Another method is to cut half the stems back at the front of an established clump, which will extend the season of flowering rather than delay it.

Summer annuals

For a successful summer bedding display in containers, why not try a trick passed on to me by my Aunt, many years ago, to help prevent them drying out too quickly. She always lined the base of each one, especially the smaller ones, with some aluminium foil, to create an inner saucer that will always retain some moisture and avoid plants drying out too quickly. I've used the tip year on year and it works for me.
