this such a success! Clarke Roofing came first with CT Electrical second and Advanta Chartered Accountants coming third so well done to them.


Enjoolata Foundation very kindly awarded us a grant for £5,000 to enable us to continue providing the services we do to families that really need our support.





# Five years on, Hellingly Community Hub pulses with parish life said. "The mix of health, humour and community makes our sessions

FIVE years after opening its doors, *Hellingly Community Hub* has firmly established itself as the beating heart of parish life.

This Autumn marks the Hub's fifth anniversary, celebrating half a decade as a multi-purpose venue that has hosted hundreds of events, welcomed thousands of visitors and transformed how this fast-growing rural community connects.

### A modern facility for a growing parish

Built to serve the whole community, the Hub boasts three flexible rooms, free Wi-Fi, air conditioning, a fully equipped kitchen, and high-quality audio-visual systems. Free parking and electric car charging points ensure accessibility for all.

Cllr Chris Jackets, Chair of the Halls Committee, recalled the project's long history, which began over a decade ago with the *Roebuck Park*  development. After delays and redesigns, the Hub opened with a focus on quality facilities, later upgraded to meet conference and event demand. "Today, the Hub offers some of the best-equipped meeting spaces in the area, with top-tier AV included in the hire fee," he said. "It combines professional standards with outstanding value."

### A hub for all ages

Over the past five years, the venue has become home to everything from toddler groups and youth clubs to fitness classes, council meetings, quiz nights, exhibitions and training sessions.

Local Pilates instructor Jenn, owner of Jen 4 Pilates and the Hub's very first hirer, says it has been central to her success "I found the perfect place to set up my classes," she

said. "The mix of health, humour and community makes our sessions unique. Marking this milestone is both a personal and professional triumph — thank you, Hellingly Hub."

### Free weekly groups

Run by *Hellingly Parish Council*, the *Hub* also offers free activities designed to bring people together, including:

- Baby & Toddler Group Mondays 8:30—10am
- Young at Heart (55+) Mondays 10:30am—12:30pm
- Youth Hub Wednesdays for Years 6—11
- Rhymetime pre-school fun
- Holiday Activity Days school holiday activities

These programmes provide a friendly, low-cost way for residents to socialise and try new things.



### Looking ahead

Parish Clerk Jenny Hoodless said the anniversary is a milestone for the whole community. "We want to thank every resident, volunteer, group leader and business who has supported the Hub over the last five years," she said. "It's your enthusiasm that has turned this space into the heart of Hellingly. We're excited to see what the next chapter brings."

"Even when I was really tired after a day's work, I went out to leaflet the local community. Last year alone, I leafleted over 10,000 houses," Stephen explains. More recently, he has expanded the business to include additional handyman services and now specialises in deep cleaning for houses and flats. Stephen continues learning new skills and plans to complete a carpentry course soon to enhance his service offerings—skills that will certainly feature on his future leaflets.



### Beachy Head Ultramarathon – Saturday 25th October 2025

This is an exciting new addition to the *Beachy Head Marathon* weekend, with runners invited to take on both the traditional Marathon route followed by the 10K route to create this endurance race with a total distance of approximately 52.6 kilometres.



### Beachy Head 10k – Saturday 25th October 2025

The 10k run will set off with a route comprising of breathtaking views and challenges, taking a shorter looping route across the Downs to Belle Tout Lighthouse and back.

### Beachy Head Half Marathon – Sunday 26th October 2025

The Beachy Head Half is now in its sixth year and begins on Sunday 26th October 2025. The route will encompass much of the marathon

route, however will detour into new surroundings which still have that amazing, picturesque scenery.

# Well, I didn't know that...

EASTBOURNE has a surprisingly rich history and some unique claims to fame. But, after doing some delving... I've found some fascinating stories and some unbelievable facts... some of which are not as true as one would believe – PART ONE.

So, we know our wonderful town nestles on England's sunny East Sussex coast and has a captivating story under the visionary guidance of the Duke of Devonshire. But what else...?

### A town of firsts

Eastbourne introduced the world's first municipal motorbus service in 1903. Operated by *Eastbourne Corporation*, it began with a Milnes-Daimler vehicle running between the railway station and Meads.

The town also had the first roller-skating rink in the UK, which was located in the Winter Garden's Floral Hall.

First to Install British-Made Traffic Lights in 1931: While not the absolute first traffic lights in the UK, Eastbourne claims to be the first to install a set that was manufactured within Britain, a point of national pride.

### The 'Whispering Windows' of Eastbourne's Town Hall

The Town Hall, a grand Victorian building, has a peculiar acoustic phenomenon in its main hall. If you stand at one end of the hall and whisper, someone at the opposite end can hear you remarkably clearly. It's often referred to as the 'whispering gallery' effect, though less grand than some cathedrals, it's still unexpected in a municipal building.

### The hidden, unfinished shingle railway tunnel

There's a largely forgotten, subterranean Victorian-era railway tunnel beneath Eastbourne. It was an ambitious but ultimately failed project designed to transport shingle along the coast to combat erosion. It was never fully operational and finally abandoned it remains sealed, a hidden relic of engineering trial and error.







### Eastbourne's lost 'Pleasure Gardens' and miniature railway

For a period in the early 20th century, Eastbourne had ambitious 'Pleasure Gardens' near the Redoubt Fortress, featuring things like a large water chute and a miniature railway. Much of this infrastructure has since vanished or been repurposed, leaving behind only echoes of a grander, more varied entertainment past.

### Birthplace of British shoe empires, Russell & Bromley and Jones the Bootmaker

Well, nearly... While *Russell* and *Bromley* is a family store in Eastbourne and was the first to carry the *Russell & Bromley* name above the door in 1880, the company's origins actually trace back to

Lewes in 1873. George Bromley, a shoemaker, married Albion Russell's daughter, Elizabeth, in Lewes, and Elizabeth's grandfather had established a shoemaking business there in 1820. The operations later moved from Eastbourne to Bromley in Kent in 1905.

And Jones the Bootmaker... This company was founded in Bayswater, London, in 1857 by Alfred and Emma Jones. While they did expand and later opened a large warehouse in Eastbourne after World War II, the company's birthplace is firmly in London.



"I want to thank the BBC for staging these Awards, and for the privilege of meeting other people nominated, who were all incredible."

As a result, Wealden District Council has authorised the following:


- Herstmonceux CE Primary School will receive £263,138.82 for additional spaces for Early Years, KS1 and KS2, a sensory space for pupils, a new entrance, reception and office area.
- Hankham Primary School will receive £39,450 to improve and extend the outdoor facilities to enable more children to access outside facilities on the school site.
- **Stone Cross School** will receive £91,737 which will enable all the children to access more facilities on the school site.
- Hailsham Library will receive £31,959 for refurbishment.



Other S106 funding payments were granted and will see an additional service 28 bus between Hailsham and Ringmer and a High Street pedestrian improvement and 20mph zone study in Polegate.

Councillor Ian Tysh, Alliance for Wealden (Green Party) and lead councillor for Planning and Environment at Wealden District Council, said, "We don't often draw attention to these payments but it's really important that local people see that the effort that goes into negotiating planning agreements on some of the larger sites in the district ensures direct benefits to the communities impacted by these developments."



# Have we lost the art of a foraging?

I REMEMBER picking blackberries and mushrooms as a child but it doesn't seem so popular these days.

However, if you are out and about and want to do a bit of foraging it is essential that you know what you are picking.

Don't pick too much in any one place, don't pick too near the footpath or too low down in case dogs have been around, or on busy main roads which will be polluted with car fumes.

Elderflowers are good for making a 'champagne' — it is best to pick them early in the morning, but they should be dry, and you should give the flowers a bit of a sniff and leave well alone if they smell of cat's pee as it won't make a tasty drink!



Autumn is when there can be an abundance of fungi, both in the woods and up on the Downs, but this is where you need to be especially careful as some are very tasty, and others can be lethal — if in doubt leave well alone.

There are also nuts around such as hazelnuts and sweet chestnuts (not horse chestnuts — they are good for conker fights, but not for eating). There may be apples in the hedgerows or maybe someone has put surplus apples, or other fruit and vegetables, in a box or barrow free for you to take or for a small contribution.

Late autumn and early winter is the time to pick sloes for making sloe gin, ideally after a frost but, as we don't seem to have as many frosts these days, you can always pop them in the freezer for a short while so they think they have been frosted!



THESE are very exciting times for the *Motcombe Pool* site in Old Town.

By the end of the year, the new Health and Wellbeing Hub should be finished in what is known as the Pool House building.

Then hopefully comes a new café – and then, if all goes to plan, the Pool could finally reopen.

The Pool shut at the start of Covid, but now a group of dedicated volunteers are thrilled with the progress being made.

Helen Nichols is Chair of *Motcombe Community Pool CIC*.

She said: "We have never doubted the interest shown by the local community or whether the demand remains for the pool.

"It has been a waiting game but we held a Fun Day in August to engage with local people and to ensure the momentum was still there.

"Work has already started on the Health Hub with Hawes Construction Group, based in Polegate, carrying out these works. It should be complete by Christmas.

"The theme will be fitness of both body and mind. There will be a gym,

yoga studio and other community facilities and spaces which people will be able to hire out.

"It will be a low impact sports studio

— that means yoga, pilates, tai chi
and other similar activities."

That's the first stage.

The next two won't be easy — that's a new cafe and then the vision of the Pool actually reopening. That's what everyone asks.

Helen said: "It's all about rebuilding the social value of the site and the potential for using renewable energy.

"Significant progress is being made and I know that potential funders are being inspired. We are also having tremendous support from Eastbourne Borough Council.

"There is tremendous potential and interest is growing."

Helen predicts that another £3m funding will be needed for the Pool to reopen. If funding is secured, it may then take another three years for the dream to become a reality.

### Green and pleasant

OCTOBER is definitely the time for clearing up – greenhouses, ponds, gutters and water butts may all need cleaning out. Wooden garden furniture will need covering or storing for the winter and terracotta pots may need bringing inside, so that they don't freeze and crack. If you don't already have a compost heap or bin, October is a great time to start one, with all the leaves and cuttings to be disposed of!

Friday 31st October is Halloween and Sunday 26th is the day the clocks go back, giving everyone an extra hour in bed! If you have children, you may have a go and creating lanterns from pumpkins purchased at the supermarket or perhaps you've grown some yourself! They look great displayed in the garden or by the front door. It is the month to think about protecting half-hardy plants with fleece or move them into a frost-free greenhouse. Make sure you sweep up any fallen leaves that harbour fungal spores and provide ideal hiding places for slugs and snails.

### **Asters**

Part of the Island Series, Aster 'Barbados' (pictured in the header at *Driftwood*) is a neat, compact

Michaelmas Daisy. The mauve-purple flowers are a tonic for fading borders from late summer to autumn. This cheery perennial is free-flowering, attracting attention from pollinating insects which are drawn to the nectarrich flowers. The upright stems and colourful blooms make this a lovely cut flower too. A useful perennial for providing late summer colour at the front of perennial borders. I've had mine in the garden for about 15 years now and they never fail to impress.

Asters are in the daisy family, and most of the varieties grown in the UK are perennial, meaning they come back every year. They generally flower in late summer and autumn, which gives them their common name Michaelmas daisy. Asters are ideal for growing in mixed borders,

with grasses and other prairie-type perennials. They are a great transition plant, bridging the seasons from summer to autumn. Their bright, daisy-like aster flowers make a colourful splash.

### **National Garden Scheme**

October is the final month of 2025 that we can visit gardens opening for the National Garden Scheme. Bates Green Garden in Tye Hill Road, Arlington opens the garden gate on Sunday 5th from 10:30am to 3:30pm with entry £7 and children £3.50. There will be home-made soup, cakes & scones plus light lunches available in the large insulated Bluebell Barn. This plantswoman's tranquil garden provides interest through the seasons. See the woodland garden created around a majestic oak tree, the colour themed middle garden and the courtyard gardens with seasonal container displays. The front garden is an autumn joy with coloured stems and leaves of cornus and salix. Check out the wildlife pond and wildflower meadow. The whole plot is gardened for nature and wildlife. Autumn visitors can enjoy spotting the abundant fungi too.

Also, on Saturday 4th in Heathfield, *Kotamaki* in Tottingworth Park, Broad Oak opens from 10am to midday with entry £12 and children £6 but pre-booking is essential at **www.ngs.org.uk** The owners will provide a Talk about the garden at 10:30am. Refreshments are included.

### **Autumnal plants**

There are a couple of nice autumn plants you might want to add to your garden. The first is a cotoneaster, they give beautiful displays of red berries in autumn. Cotoneaster horizontalis is popular for the characteristic herringbone pattern of its stems, which makes it useful trained across

the ground or on a wall. The second, another really good plant is the chrysanthemum, it flowers well into autumn. They will flower right up to Christmas if you are lucky and make great flower stems to cut for vases in the house too. One of my favourites in the beach garden at the moment is the stunning verbena "polaris", it has stunning lilac flowers and is a prostrate variety that comes back like mad every year. I planted it back in 2012 when I first created the beach garden and it looks very pretty set against the shingle.

### Falling leaves

Autumn is a beautiful season in the garden, with many perennials, shrubs and trees providing some stunning colour. But once the leaves have fallen, they will need clearing up, especially from lawns, where they will smother the grass, and from paths and patios, where they may become slippery. It's also a good idea to remove leaves from gravel, otherwise it will become messy. You can make the sweeping and collection process a lot easier by using a combination of different tools and methods, but I favour doing it all by hand in my garden, due to its size and layout. This year will be more challenging for me, having had my knee replacement earlier in the year, kneeling is not as easy as it used to be.
